I. Course Objectives and goals:

EAK202Y is the second half of the second year Korean. The course provides students further conversational & grammatical skills beyond those learned in the first semester. The objective of the course is continuing to work further on students' speaking, listening, reading, and writing skills at the intermediate level. The course introduces various kinds of authentic materials such as audio/ video clips, songs, children's books, internet articles, etc. in addition to the required reading materials in order to help students acquire Korean and its culture in context.

At the end of the semester, the Students would be able to: 1. command a lengthy dialogue regarding various topics such as describing physical appearance of someone or something, giving and receiving advice, talking about personal experiences, compare and contrast, etc. 2. express their ideas into written language with more accurate spellings and punctuations; 3. better understand on culture and cultural aspects of Korea; 4. type Korean letters

The class will be divided into two tracks depending on the students' language skills and necessities: Track 1. Language Track.(LT) and Track 2. Reading and Writing Track. (RWT). Tuesday classes will focus only on speaking and listening practices for the LT students , and reading comprehension and writing practices for the RWT students

*** **Oral Performance** There will be two student's projects: PowerPoint Presentation and video project (skit). Detailed guidelines and samples will be discussed in the class.

**** **Quizzes** Vocabulary/ & diction quizzes will be given for every chapter. You can drop 1 lowest grade for your final grade. There will be NO Chapter quizzes.
