## 2. University of Oxford

Note: The Oxford system operates differently from most American universities in several ways. The terms are eight-week trimesters, with examinations in the ninth week. My teaching responsibilities there included (1) lecture courses in the Faculties of Oriental Studies and Modern Languages [required to teach one such course in each of two terms]; (2) graduate seminars in those divisions, which a colleague and I convened two terms per year [no minimum requirement]; and (3) introductory graduate-level seminars for the Diploma Programme in Jewish Studies [one course per year]. I taught extra courses each year to meet student demand; how much extra depended on the level of interest in any given academic year. The rest of my teaching was done in tutorials (individuals or small groups) and supervising graduate work.
