Nonfatal violence includes rape, sexual assault, robbery, aggravated assault, and simple assault. These data do not include fatal violence. "Intimate partners" include current or former spouses, and current or former boyfriends or girlfriends; same sex relationships are included. In 2003 racial categories were revised by the Source; therefore caution is warranted when examining racial categories over time. Nonfatal intimate partner victimization rates of black and Hispanic males are not provided because the small number of cases is insufficient for reliable estimates.
