Federal, State, city, university and college, county, and tribal law enforcement agencies participating in the UCR Program submit data on any sworn officer killed feloniously or accidentally in the line of duty within their jurisdictions. FBI field divisions and legal attaché offices also report such incidents occurring in the United States and its territories, as well as those in which a United States law enforcement officer dies while assigned to duties in another country (Source: 2007 [Online]. Available: <http://www.fbi.gov/ucr/killed/2007/methodologykilled.html>). Some data have been revised by the Source and may differ from previous editions of SOURCEBOOK.

The Ns presented and the distribution of characteristics are based on the known number of victim officers at the time the initial FBI report is published. Therefore, the Ns presented above may differ from other tables that include totals subsequently revised by the Source.

^a Percents may not add to 100 because of rounding. Also, for some years, age, race, or length of service was not reported for a small number of cases. Percents are computed on total number of cases and therefore may not total 100.

^b Does not include the deaths of 72 law enforcement officers resulting from the events of Sept. 11, 2001.

^c Includes Asian, Pacific Islander, American Indian, Alaskan Native, and not reported.

^d Beginning in 2005, the Source revised the length of service categories: 1 to 4 years of service was changed to 1 to 5 years of service and 5 to 10 years of service was changed to 6 to 10 years of service. Therefore the figures for 2005 and subsequent years are not directly comparable to previous years.
