AMERICA EAST TITLE GAME: UAlbany's **Jamar Wilson** scored 22 points and **Jason Siggers** added 14 in leading their team to a 60-59 victory over Vermont for its second consecutive America East Conference championship on Saturday, March 10 at UVM's Patrick Gymnasium. The Great Danes, who won for the first time in 10 trips to Burlington since 1925, earned a second straight NCAA berth. UAlbany (23-9) became just the second No. 2 seed in conference history to beat a top seed on their home floor in the championship final. In a game that featured 13 lead changes and five ties, Vermont (25-7) took a 54-53 lead on **Keith Cieplicki's** 15-foot jumper. UAlbany's **Brian Lillis** put his team ahead with a 3-pointer, before UVM's **Mike Trimboli** made a pair of free throws to draw his team even at 56 apiece. Wilson, the championship's most outstanding player, then connected on back-to-back field goals. His spinning one-hander in the lane gave his club a 60-56 lead. After Cieplicki's steal and basket off a goaltending call sliced the lead to one, Vermont played for the last shot with 32 seconds left. But Trimboli dribbled the ball off **Carl Ross'** foot and **Brent Wilson** came up with loose ball and ran out the clock. **Marqus Blakely** and Trimboli each had 10 points. Brent Wilson had six points and nine rebounds.

2007 AMERICA EAST STANDINGS: Vermont won the America East Conference regular-season title and the earned the conference postseason tournament's top seed. The Great Danes finished second to capture the No. 2 seed. UAlbany went on to capture its second consecutive America East Tournament championship. **America East Standings:** 1. Vermont (25-7, AE 15-1), 2. UAlbany (23-9, 13-3), 3. Boston U. (12-18, 8-8), T4. Maine (12-18, 7-9), T4. UMBC (12-19, 7-9), T6. Binghamton (13-16, 6-10), T6. Hartford (13-18, 6-10), T6. NCAA BRACKET: UAlbany is seeded No. 13 in the South Regional bracket. The Great Danes were the No. 16 seed one year ago when they battled top-seeded Connecticut at Philadelphia's Wachovia Center. Vermont, as the America East champion, earned a No. 13 seed in 2005. The Catamounts were also seeded #15 in 2004 and #16 in 2003 in their run of three consecutive NCAA appearances.

AMERICA EAST CHAMPIONSHIP: The Great Danes, who tied the program's record for conference wins, finished second in the America East standings and were the No. 2 seed for the 2007 championship tournament. Previous to last Saturday's championship final, the No. 1 seed had a 58-7 tournament record and had won 17 of 24 conference titles since 1983. UAlbany was the top seed in the 2005-06 campaign after winning the regular season. The Great Danes went on to win their first-ever A-East championship.

2006-07 SEASON: UAlbany put together another list of impressive achievements for the second consecutive season. The Great Danes, who captured last year's America East Conference championship and reached the NAAs for the first time, won just five games in the 2003-04 campaign.

NO. 1 VS. NO. 2: The 2007 America East Conference championship final featured a meeting between the top two seeds for the 14th time. No. 1 had defeated the second seed in 11 of the previous 12 matchups. Vermont, as the No. 2 seed, edged Boston U., 56-55, in the 2003 championship game. UAlbany became the second program to accomplish that feat in a 60-59 win on March 10, 2007.

20 WINS: UAlbany has reached the 20-win mark in consecutive seasons for the first time in 17 years. The Great Danes set a school record for victories with a 25-3 mark in 1993-94. UAlbany has recorded twelve 20-win campaigns in its history. Albany first hit the 20-win plateau in the 1960-61 season.

POSTSEASON PLAY: UAlbany has a 30-34 record in postseason tournament play, including three victories in this year's America East Conference Tournament en route to the title. The Great Danes, as the top seed, won all three America East Conference tournament games in 2006. UAlbany defeated Vermont, 80-67, in the championship, before dropping a 72-59 decision in Philadelphia to No. 2 Connecticut in the 2006 NCAA First Round. Albany was the No. 4 seed when they suffered a 76-70 setback to Binghamton in the 2005 America East quarterfinal round. UAlbany was the No. 10 seed in a 43-38 loss to New Hampshire in the 2004 America East opening round. The Great Danes fell to No. 2 Vermont in 2003 and No. 3 Hartford the previous year in A-East quarterfinal round play.

UALBANY VS. RANKED TEAMS: UAlbany played a nationally-ranked team for the fourth consecutive season in the matchup with No. 18 Connecticut on Nov. 26. The Great Danes lost to #16 UCLA, 73-65, at Pauley Pavilion in 2005-06 and dropped a 72-59 decision to No. 2 UConn in the 2006 NCAA Tournament. UAlbany faced #7 Syracuse and #22 Pittsburgh in the previous two seasons.

CONFERENCE RECORD: The Great Danes tied their best league record in America East Conference play with a 13-3 mark. Albany also went 13-3 in 2005-06. UAlbany swept the regular-season with six league opponents, including Boston U., UMBC, Hartford, Stony Brook, Maine and New Hampshire.

CONFERENCE AWARDS: UAlbany placed three on the All-America East Conference teams for the second straight year. **Jamar Wilson**, the 2007 player of the year, was a first-team all-conference selection. **Jason Siggers** and **Brent Wilson** were on the first and third teams, respectively.

HEAD COACH: UAlbany's **Will Brown** is in his sixth season as head coach. He was named the 2006 New York State Basketball Coaches Association's Coach of the Year after leading UAlbany to the America East Conference championship and an NCAA berth. Brown was appointed to the position on March 13, 2002, after coaching on an interim basis for the final 20 games of the 2001-02 season. He has a 76-92 career record. Brown was previously the head coach at Sullivan County Community College in Loch Sheldrake, New York, for three years. He led the Generals to a 30-2 record and an appearance in the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) championship in 2000-01. Brown, at age 35, is the 15th youngest Division I head coach in the nation. He was listed among the top college basketball coaches under age 40 by SI.com earlier this season.

PLAYER OF THE YEAR: UAlbany's **Jamar Wilson** was voted by the league's coaches as the 2007 America East Conference Player of the Year. Wilson, a senior who averaged 18.6 points, 6.3 rebounds and 4.9 assists, is among a select group of players who have earned both the conference's player and rookie awards during his career. The list includes Taylor Coppenrath (Vermont), T.J. Sorrentine (Vermont), Tunji Awojobi (Boston University) and former Boston Celtics standout Reggie Lewis (Northeastern). Wilson also became the fourth player in conference history to win consecutive player

AMERICA EAST CONFERENCE

UAlbany is in its sixth year as a full member of America East Conference. Eighteen of the school's 19 varsity teams are eligible for conference championships and NCAA post-season play. America East basketball members include Binghamton, Boston University, Hartford, Maine, UMBC (Maryland-Baltimore County), New Hampshire, Stony Brook and Vermont. UAlbany elevated its entire athletics program for men and women to the NCAA Division I level in the 1999-2000 academic year.

SEFCUARENA

UAlbany's SEFCU Arena opened in December 1992. The on-campus facility seats capacity crowds of nearly 5,000 and is the home for men's and women's basketball and the UAlbany indoor track & field teams. The Great Danes have a combined 116-65 record at the SEFCU Arena.

NCAA DIVISION I

UAlbany's 19-sport intercollegiate athletics program for men and women upgraded to the NCAA Division I level in September 1999. The Great Danes accepted an invitation to become a full member of the America East Conference, beginning with the 2001-02 academic year. Eighteen varsity teams are eligible for conference championships and NCAA post-season competition. UAlbany football has been an associate member of the Northeast Conference since 1999.

BASKETBALL'S HISTORY

The UAlbany program began varsity play in 1909-10, and competed at the NAIA, NCAA College Division, NCAA Division II, and NCAA Division III levels prior to September 1999. In their 93rd season, the Great Danes have a 1,041-757 record. Albany has made 12 NCAA tournament and 11 ECAC playoff appearances since 1969. UAlbany's program moved to Division II in 1995-96.

TELEVISION COVERAGE

UAlbany will appear six times on the America East Conference package, while Time Warner Cable will televise five games. America East and ESPN Regional Television will team up to produce and distribute games throughout the conference's geographical footprint. The telecasts will also be available on-line via video streaming at AmericaEast.com, through the conference's multimedia partner, XOS Technologies. UAlbany games against New Hampshire (Jan. 3), Vermont (Jan. 13), Boston U. (Jan. 24 & Feb. 25), Binghamton (Feb. 3) and Maine (Feb. 7) are on America East TV. Time Warner Cable will offer five games on its TW3 channel, starting with St. Bonaventure on Dec. 16. The TW3 schedule also features Stony Brook (Jan. 15), Hartford (Jan. 21), UMBC (Jan. 31) and Vermont (Feb. 11). Time Warner serves more than 400,000 customers in the Capital Region and western Massachusetts.

ABOUT VIRGINIA: The Cavaliers, who finished with a 20-10 record, earned a share of the Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season title. Virginia is receiving votes in both the Associated Press and USA Today/ESPN national polls. **Dave Leitao** was named the ACC and NABC District 5 coach of the year. Leitao, who is in his second season, led UVa to its most conference wins since the 1994-95 campaign. **Sean Singletary**, a third-team NABC All-American, was selected to the All-ACC first team for the second consecutive year. Singletary, a 6-foot junior, led the team in scoring at 18.9 points per game, plus averaged 4.5 rebounds and 4.6 assists. He canned 76-of-192 three-point attempts. **J.R. Reynolds**, a 6'2" senior, provides Virginia with an all-conference backcourt as he was voted to the second team. Reynolds contributes 17.8 points and 4.0 rebounds, and has made 53 three-pointers. He turned in a 40-point performance against Wake Forest on Jan. 21 when he made six 3-point shots. **Mamadi Diane** (6'5") and **Adrian Joseph** (6'7") score at a 9.9 and 7.2 clip, respectively. **Jason Cain** adds 6.7 points and a team-leading 6.4 rebounds. His tip-in provided the Cavaliers with a 64-63 win at Clemson. Cain, a 6-foot-10 senior, has eight career double-doubles.

THE SERIES: UAlbany and Virginia are meeting for the first time. The Great Danes will face their first-ever Atlantic Coast Conference opponent. UVa and UAlbany have previously met in NCAA Tournament play, a 2005 first-round men's lacrosse game at Klockner Stadium in Charlottesville.

MILESTONES: UAlbany upgraded its intercollegiate athletics program to the NCAA Division I level in the 1999-2000 academic year. The Great Danes joined the America East Conference in 2001-02.

BRACKETBUSTERS: The Great Danes were invited to participate in the O'Reilly ESPNU BracketBusters series on Feb. 16. UAlbany played in a nationally-televised game on ESPNU for the second consecutive year. The team's travel plans to Boise, Idaho were rearranged due to an East Coast snowstorm that dumped two feet in the Capital Region. UAlbany was forced to bus to Washington, D.C. where a split travel group flew from two different airports. The second group just made it to Taco Bell Arena for Friday's gameday shootaround. After a one-point loss in a game that featured 33 lead changes and six ties, the team was delayed again on the way home. The Great Danes finally arrived on campus on Sunday, Feb. 18 at 3:00 a.m. The entire trip lasted 69 hours and covered 5,477 miles.

WINNING STREAK: The Great Danes had their string of eight consecutive victories halted following a 67-63 loss against Vermont on Feb. 11. The win skein tied the longest streak in the program's Division I history. UAlbany set the record with eight victories in a row last year, from Dec. 20-Jan. 14.

CAREER SCORER: UAlbany's **Jamar Wilson** became the school's all-time scoring leader on Jan. 13 with a 22-point performance against Vermont. Gary Holway had held that record for nearly 48 years, when he tallied 1,851 points from 1955-59. Wilson currently has 2,139 points. He became the eleventh player in America East Conference history to reach the 2,000-plateau. The first-team all-conference performer has scored 20-plus points on 49 occasions during his career. The UAlbany tri-captain has also reached double figures in 105 of 119 games played as a collegian.

SEFCU ARENA: SEFCU, the largest credit union in the Capital Region, and the University at Albany announced on Nov. 1, 2006 a \$2.75 million commitment to name the university's Recreation and Convocation Center, in addition to promotional opportunities, for a 10-year period. The facility, to be known as SEFCU Arena, is the home for UAlbany's men's and women's basketball teams. The SEFCU Arena will continue to expand its role as a major venue for community and sporting events.

2006 AMERICA EAST TITLE GAME: UAlbany's **Jamar Wilson** scored 29 points in leading his team to its first-ever America East Conference championship and NCAA Division I Tournament berth in an 80-67 victory over Vermont before a capacity crowd of 4,538 fans on March 11, 2006. UAlbany rolled to an 18-4 lead in the opening seven minutes and never trailed. **Lucious Jordan** scored seven of his 18 points in that outburst, including a 3-point field goal from the top of the arc on his team's first possession. Wilson added a three-point play when he was fouled in transition. **Brian Lillis'** tip-in of a missed foul shot and Jordan's driving layup finished the run. The Catamounts, who had captured the previous three America East championships, would trail 44-26 at halftime. Wilson, the tournament MVP, increased his team's lead to 58-36 in the second half with another three-point play. The Great Danes, who had won 19 of their last 23 contests following the victory, would later push out to a 27-point advantage when Jordan drilled a three-pointer from the left side with 7:14 remaining. Freshman **Mike Trimboli** had 16 points for the Catamounts, who were limited to 38.9-percent shooting.

DIVISION I SCORING: Senior swingman **Jason Siggers** scored a career-high 34 points, including 22 in the first half, against Vermont on Jan. 13. Siggers, who made 14-of-24 from the field and 6-of-7 from the line, produced the third-highest single-game total in UAlbany's Division I history.

2006-07 SEASON PREVIEW

It all came together for the University at Albany basketball program last year, as the Great Danes shook off an indifferent start to win 19 of their last 24 games. The results were an America East Conference championship and the school's first NCAA Division I Tournament appearance.

Despite losing three players who played a major role in that run to the championship, UAlbany still has a solid corps of players that could possibly turn in a repeat performance.

"This is new territory for us," says UAlbany coach **Will Brown**, who signed a contract last spring that will keep him at the school through the 2010-11 campaign. "We enjoyed the taste of last season but now we want more. Our team learned about expectations last year and we will face similar obstacles this season."

The Great Danes return three starters, including the conference player of the year, from a squad that established the program's Division I victory record and led national power Connecticut deep into the second half in an NCAA first-round game. The roster features two seniors, six juniors, two sophomores and four freshmen.

"We have a nice mix of veterans and newcomers," Brown states. "We are deep on the perimeter and can play a variety of ways. Our team will be paying attention to detail as we prepare, especially with regard to defense, rebounding and execution."

UALBANY BY POSITIONS

GUARDS: Any talk about UAlbany's backcourt begins with Associated Press All-America guard **Jamar Wilson**, a difference-making player who was named the 2006 America East player of the year and the championship's most outstanding player. He averaged 17.7 points, 4.9 rebounds and 3.9 assists.

"When your best player is your hardest-working player then you have a chance to be successful," Brown states. "Jamar makes plays and loves a challenge with his fearless style. The bigger the game, the better he is."

Wilson, who totaled 19 points and six rebounds in his team's first-ever NCAA appearance, also picked up valuable experience on a collegiate all-star tour of France in August.

"He came back from that trip with a great appreciation for this program," Brown explains about Wilson, who is within range of becoming the school's all-time leading scorer during the season. "His teammates knew about UAlbany and

what the basketball team was able to accomplish last year."

While Wilson is a marquee performer, **Brian Lillis**, a 6-foot-5 junior, is the glue that holds the team together. All UAlbany did was win after Lillis was inserted into the starting lineup at the lead guard spot last December. His numbers are not dramatic, but he does something in every category.

"He can play almost every position on the floor and competes with great energy," says Brown about a player who contributed 4.4 points, 4.2 rebounds and 2.1 assists per outing. "He has the ability to expand his game and has been encouraged to be more aggressive on offense."

Jon Iati, a sharp-shooter with a quick release, and **Jason Siggers** (6'4") were proven scorers off the bench last season. Iati scored at a 6.7 clip and drilled 40 three-point field goals. Siggers, who played in all 32 games in his first year with the program, averaged 5.0 points and improved as the season progressed.

"Jon is as good a shooter as there is in the conference," Brown states. "You know you are deep when he is coming off the bench. I defended Jason (Siggers) as well as anyone last year because I didn't play him enough early on. He could be a consistent double-figure scorer for us."

The Great Danes dipped into the junior colleges for depth with the addition of backcourt players **Michael Knight** (6'3") and **Carl Ross** (6'4"). Knight made 41 three-pointers in the Florida JUCO ranks as an all-region performer. Ross, an explosive athlete, averaged 13.7 points as an all-conference star in California. **David Bauman** (6'2") and freshman **Lance James** (5'11") are available here.

FORWARDS: The Great Danes also return an All-America East player in the frontcourt. **Brent Wilson**, a 6-foot-8 junior, made the all-conference third team in 2005-06. He averaged 10.4 points and 4.3 rebounds, plus led the team with 56 three-point field goals.

"He's ready to build on his successes over the last two years," Brown offers. "He is the best shooting big man in the conference, and has developed his post play by adding a jump hook with either hand."

Brian Connelly (6'8") showed a tremendous upside to his play as a freshman. He even saw quality minutes in all three America East postseason tournament contests.

"He is a skilled four-man who could steal minutes at the 'five' spot," Brown says. "He has an excellent mid-range game and has spent a lot of time in the weight room."

Mike Yocum, a 6'9" freshman, may also get an opportunity to play on the baseline with his athleticism. Freshman **Reid Anderson** (6'5") will move between the two-guard and small forward positions, plus can do a little bit of everything with his active style.

CENTERS: UAlbany will have to replace a key component to last year's success, as 7-foot-1 Kirsten Zoellner has graduated to the Greek professional league. Sophomore **Jimmie Covington** (6'7") and **Brett Gifford**, a 6-foot-11 freshman, are the immediate options.

Covington, who spelled Zoellner last year, has both the size and strength to play center and the experience of appearing in 31 games last year. Gifford, an all-state selection in Missouri, brings a solid set of offensive skills.

"Jimmie is a more confidence player and has used the offseason to his advantage," Brown comments. "Brett has a nice touch with both hands around the basket but will have to get acclimated to the college game's pace."

OUTLOOK: UAlbany's rise has come in defined steps over the previous seasons, and now comes the business of defending a title. "Repeating is tough, but that comes with doing something for the first time," Brown explains. "We welcome the new challenge with open arms. In a league like the America East, there is no room for error. We need to put ourselves in a good position to take care of business in conference play."
