Course Prerequisites

Pre-requisites for SSW courses are outlined on the following page.

Students without the prerequisites or written permission of the instructor may be deregistered from the course for which he or she is ineligible. Written permission from the instructor must be obtained prior to registering for the course.

WHAT ARE BLENDED COURSES?

Blended courses combine the best of two teaching methods, online (web-based) teaching and in-person (in class) teaching. Up to half the course work will be on-line, conducted on the web. Typically, you will do readings, on-line discussions, exercises and written assignments at your own pace (not in class), over a week's time. Some weeks, the class will not meet - all the work will be on-line. Other weeks the class will meet at its scheduled time, in the traditional in-person format, to apply the course content. To participate in the blended course, you need a computer with internet access and software programs. The web format will be Blackboard. Participation does not require extensive computer skills, although it helps to have some comfort with the web and email.
