EXECUTIVE ORDER

No 3: Elections Commission

WHEREAS, The Student Associations Policies for elections are often challenged; and

WHEREAS, Student Association goal is to create a transparent and trusting atmosphere for this organization; and

WHEREAS, the officers of the Student Association work on behalf of the student body; and

WHEREAS, the current policies for elections should be reviewed by the public and with input from the everyday student;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Daniel Truchan III, President of Student Association, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of Student Association do hereby order as follows:

1. The Office of the Student Association President shall create the Elections Commission.
2. This Commission will review all of the Student Association 600 By-laws (Election Policy).
3. The Vice President of the Student Association shall be the Chair of this Commission.
4. The Student Association President shall appoint three student members to the Commission.
5. The Student Association President shall appoint one faculty member from the Political Science Department to act as an advisor to the board with no voting rights.
6. The Student Association Senate Chairman will appoint three members to the Commission; one must be a member of the Rules and Operations Committee.

7. The Elections Commission will have until February 25th, 2009 to hold hearings and review said policies. A final report to the SA President is due no later than March 4th, 2009.
