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Q And they didn't do anything about it?

They said I was there for the DVR Project. Α

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They never put me there until I requested though.

We find out that that project wasn't very much in any case. But you have not gone to school here either. So that you are still not prepared to go out, you know, to go out in the world to earn your own living.

Well, ma'am, I am prepared to go out there any Α time.

That is something else, yes. But you are not prepared intellectually to earn your living and you are not prepared psychologically because they haven't helped you at all.

I could go out there and swing a mop as a Α However, I would like to hold a better paying job and I don't have the education for it and the training.

I understand that perfectly well, but it's natural, it's not nice to be in prison but of course, you have so many years to go. You have to make the very best that you can. You have almost everything in your favor when you get out to make a good start to be like everybody else, you know, not to do the things that you did before.

We are trying to find out, of course, why you

You have been telling us, of course, you are not helped. You didn't know English and nobody was allowed to talk Spanish with you, rather nobody came to help you in your language.

A That's correct.

Q In the language that you know, the language of your parents and the language of your country.

A Right.

Q Nobody--the books were all in English, nobody will give you a book in Spanish?

A Right.

Q You couldn't get a book in Spanish either.

A Right.

Q You figure that has helped in a way because you are able to talk English fairly well now?

A I was forced into it.

Q Well, that is good. It isn't bad.

How is your Spanish, by the way?

A Perfect. As perfect as can be six years from school.

Q And also only 6th grade of schooling.

A Right.

Q Well, I would ask you the same thing that you were asked before, why aren't you going to school to

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finish your elementary schooling and get your high school education. You said because these older people are there and you feel it's a waste of time.

Α Another factor --

Is that what you said before? You feel it's a waste of time?

What I am saying is, they don't pay you Α enough.

All right, but I want--this is only like as Q if I were your mother, I would be telling you that. You might get more money now by not going to school, but you are never going to get any money ever in your life unless you go to school.

You will always be getting the least possible amount of money and that, naturally, might get you again into trouble. But this is, of course, this is--

I think after spending the best years of my life in prison, I think that should be lesson enough. If I have to just sweep streets, I will stay out there.

I know that. I know. I am with you but the Q point is that you should have the greater ambition because you have so much for you, going for you.

Let me answer that question you just said. Α What is it to have am bition and if you go to school you find that the school system is too decayed, decayed

where you actually are learning nothing. I 503 mean nothing. So you might as well go do some work and earn some money because you go to school right now--before, and right now it's still the same way because the school is situated in a gallery. You have 42 men on this side and 42 men on the other side. This man is coming back and forth. These cells are banging open. You can't pay attention to what you're doing in the first place. You understand what I am saying?

Q Yes, I do.

A In other words, they never have made a real thought since I have been in Attica to put the education level as to what it should be. This is my point I am trying to get across. If I am going to school and I can learn anything and at the same time I am starving because I can't get enough money to buy my needs I might as well go and work.

Q Well, I know that there is a great deal of discrimination, obviously, in the United States against anybody who comes from another country. It's always been like that and we hope that eventually it will not be like that, but meanwhile, this is what happens. This is what is going on. Especially when you don't have sufficient training. So that you are always in the lower ladder, you know, steps of life. In economic

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504 position. So we got to be prepared and to study a great deal in order to be able, you as a young man, in order to be able to completely change this attitude of the people of the United States, you see, but if you don't study, even if you have to go hungry now, if you don't study, you are not going to be able to do much and you have so much going for you.

Of course, this doesn't do you much good for another four years in prison, but I am telling it to you from the bottom of my heart.

I believe you very much.

It is a thing too, for you to speak to me from up there and tell me of this. But when you are in a prison where you see so much discrimination given to your people, it's a shame.

What can I say?

MR. McKAY: Mr. Martinez, our time has very nearly run. If you want to make your statement, we will be glad to have you do it now.

MR. HENIX: Before he speaks, I have a question.

MR. McKAY: I think we're going off the air in a very short time. We would like at least for the public to have your statement and then we will continue in the studio with other questions.

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THE WITNESS: I have a writing

because--

MR. McKAY: Please use whatever you wish.

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THE WITNESS: To the McKay Commission and society in general:

The conditions which now exist in Attica remain deplorable, especially in the following areas:

Officer-inmate relations. Medical atten-Recreation. Food. Spanish-black personnel. tion. Consequently, there's only one Puerto Rican officer and one black officer.

The public has been led to believe through the issuance of half truths, no truths and outright lies, that the conditions are improving here at Attica.

The public is told that inmates are allowed phone calls, but they are not told that this privilege is limited to Wallkill Prison.

The public is told that the inmates' diet has improved in nutrition, but they are not told that the diet remains to be planned, monotonous mess which does not change month after month.

Variety, taste and preparation must also be considered along with nutrition. The public is told that the present tension at Attica is caused

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by the State's failure to issue new clothes, blankets and toilet articles. This is an outright lie, which has been put forth by the local union which represents the correctional officers.

This was done for apparently selfish reasons.

The inmates want an expanded work release program, educational and vocational programs, better medical treatment, less cell time.

Inmates are still being treated with callous indifference and outrageous disrespect.

This is my statement.

I would like to, if it's possible at this time, to address myself to everybody out there, especially the young, the ki-s that are coming up now in this ghettos. It's not worth it. It's as simple as that. I would like society to also realise that, like myself, there are hundreds of Luis Martinezes out in the street who eventually wind up like myself unless something is done about them in time. And I know, I seen them coming year and year younger and younger and younger and it's a shame. That is all.

MR. McKAY: Thank you, Mr. Martinez. is a fine statement. Are you willing to stay for a

moment longer to answer further questions

the Commission may have?

EXAMINATION BY MR. HENIX:

Q I would like to share with you the fact I think you know that—I would like to share with you the reality of part of my life. I was just like you, one of those kinds that made a lot of mistakes, you know. I went down the drain. But there is things I want to ask you, you know, in reference to prison.

You have talked about your experience in prison and in my mind to some extent a very limited way. I don't recall you saying anything about ever having been in HBZ. Have you ever been in HBZ?

- A Yes, sir.
- Q Could you tell us something about that?

A Well, HBZ, the first time I went was--I went to the observation section. I was sent there by the prison doctor because I repeatedly came back requesting medical attention and this was a way to get rid of me actually without giving me detention. What it amounted to was a mattress on the floor at that time.

Your food was brought in a bowl where all was piled on top of each other and it was actually, you only got to see a psychiatirst about once a week on Monday.

If you came on Tuesday, that meant you had to wait until

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next week. And that was it. That was 508 the amount of observation within the prison.

In addition to that, we have had several wit-Q nesses here today who has denied any knowledge or any physical evidence of brutality within the prison. Do you share their view?

- No, I don't. Α
- Have you any personal experience?

Yes, I have. On one occasion I have taken what Α is called the joy ride.

Would you explain it? Q

Well, in one occasion I was taken up to HBZ and the normal procedure is that the elevator is stopped between two floors so there is no witnesses , but the correction guards themselves who take you up there and a workout is proceeding there.

- Q What is a workout?
- You get beaten.
- Q Do they try to black your eyes or crack your skull or hit you in places where it can't be easily detected?

It doesn't make any difference. You ain't going to see nobody anyway.

And the guard that would be on this HBZ where this took place, it would be almost impossible for

him to not know that you have been ripped on that elevator?

A Of course. A lot of times after you get out of there, there is Blood all over the place.

- Q I would like to ask you some questions about job discrimination.
  - A That exists in Attica one hundred per cent.
- Q You see, I asked these questions because this has been my experience years ago and everybody is talking about change. Yet Attica took place and as if magically we had Attica. It's very difficult for me to accept this in view of my own past experience and I really wanted to ask you these questions in reference to personal experiences that you had and I know you are aware of the fact that you are under oath.

A Yes, sir.

Q I have no reason to question your integrity.

I think you are a very courageous, in fact, to be as
forthright as you have been and still have to go back to
Attica. And still have to look forward to other powers
for considerations at a later date in your life.

Those are considerations. And I don't have any browbeating for you, man. All I can say is I admire the fact that you are trying to do something if the conditions are like you say they are and also under the

conditions to be able to have gotten to the 510 point where you are at where you can speak to a group of people as sophisticated as this group and be perfectly understood, whether you got it in one of the conventional schools or you got it like you said, the hard way, you got it.

A Thank you, sir.

MR. McKAY: Mr. Rothschild?

MR. ROTHSCHILD: No questions.

MR. McKAY: Bishop Broderick?

## BY MR. BRODERICK:

Q I have one question. Were you on heroin at the time you committed this felony?

A Yes, sir, I was.

Q Did the Judge know that and the jury, I assume you had a jury of some kind?

A Well, sir, I really couldn't tell you. I don't know whether my lawyer made that fact aware. I know I was given treatment.

Q It would seem to be very important for the lawyer to say.

A Well, I have--

Q My point I think is, I wonder why you were sent to a place like Attica rather than to a hospital.

Are you off the kick, are you off heroin now?

1	A Well, I have been in here in jail six 511
2	years.
3	Q Did you cure yourself, is that it?
4	A I couldn't answer that. I don't know. If
5	you mean if there is any side effects, psychological
6	effects, I'm not in a position to know. I don't know. I
7	might go out there and use it again for all I know.
8	Q But you feel cured?
9	A Cured, rehabilitated, you feel you are off
10	heroin? You have no attraction to it or inclination for
11	it?
12	A Not attraction but let's put it this way.
13	There is none to be had.
14	Q And this is the only reason?
15	A I wouldn't say it's the only reason. I don't
16	know if you put some here, I don't know if I will be
17	tempted to use it or not, so I couldn't really
18	Q Is there any help you get up there, do they
19	say that you were once a drug user and now you come to
20	class or do you see à pyschiatrist or a psychologist or
21	a counselor? No one even bothers about helping you?
22	A Unless you request some type of help, and some-
23	times you might get it. That is about it.
24	MR. BRODERICK: Thank you.
25	BY MR. WILBANKS:

Q I had a wrong impression, I think, at 512 the beginning and perhaps the public did too. Maybe I am wrong. I want to clarify it again. You mentioned that when you came to Attica, you came for the purpose of the DVR Project.

A That was the reason that they gave me.

Q I got the impression when you said that that when you got there, when you arrived, the DVR Project was in existence but you simply weren't assigned but later on you said you had been there nine months and then you found out that it had been open two months and then you requested to be transferred, in other words, when you first arrived at Attica was DVR actively in operation?

A No.

Q That was what I wasn't quite clear about. I wanted to make sure.

A That's right.

## BY MR. LIMAN:

Q When did you have this experience in the elevator going up to the box?

A I had just come from the hospital. Rather the day before I come from the hospital. As a matter of fact I got a lawsuit filed against the prison administrator,

Martinez against Mancusi, for the--
