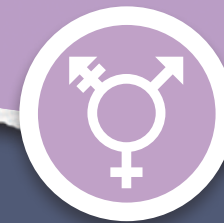

Did you know?

Transgender people are often targeted for sexual violence simply because of their gender identity and expression.

Reasons why perpetrators of sexual violence may often target this group include the following:

- Perpetrators of sexual violence against transgender individuals are often attempting to “change” the victim’s gender identity, their expression of it, or to humiliate them.
- Thinking that the victim will not report the assault out of fear, shame, etc. and if they did report, that no one would believe them.

DID YOU ALSO KNOW THAT...

Talking to a counselor about an assault can be helpful.

The University Counseling Center offers free and confidential counseling and consultation. Student visits and conversations do not become part of their academic record.

Got consent?



A consensual sexual act or behavior requires that individuals:

- Agree to sexual activity freely and knowingly.
- Do not use threat, intimidation or coercion.
- Are not temporarily or permanently impaired by drugs, alcohol, or any other physical/mental impairment.
- Are not unconscious or asleep.
- Are not under the age of 17 years.

Get yourself to a safe place

Seek immediate medical treatment

- Because most injuries are not obvious, a medical exam is important.
- Receiving medical care does not require you or the medical staff to file a police report.
- Seek medical care from a hospital emergency room where professionals are certified to do a rape kit. A rape kit is a medical examination in which sexual assault evidence is collected.

Save evidence - consider a forensic rape exam

A forensic exam is done to collect evidence and is free of charge whether or not you choose to file a police report.

It is best not to shower, bathe, douche, rinse your mouth or wash the clothes you wore and to be seen within 36 hours.

You can still go for an exam within 5 days of the assault.

Seek medical care even if you decide you don't want a rape kit performed.



Seek counseling, support, and/or advocacy services

It can be helpful to speak informally and confidentially with a counselor or other designated campus staff to determine what options, support, and help are available.
