

Cortney N von Hahmann wins the 2013 Moissan Summer Undergraduate Research Fellowship in Fluorine Chemistry of the American Chemical Society.

The \$4000 Fellowship provides funds for the student's summer salary and research support for the conduct of research in any area of fluorine chemistry. In addition, a limited stipend is available for the student to present their research results at an ACS-sponsored meeting. The award is the outcome of an international competition among student applicants.

Cortney has been an undergraduate research student in the Welch lab for the last year. She is a co-author on a contribution to the 245th National Meeting of the ACS to be held New Orleans in April as well as being a co-author on a manuscript-in-preparation describing her work on the synthesis of pentafluorosulfanylated β -lactams.

Cortney will use her fellowship to defray the costs of her study this summer at the University of St. Andrews in Scotland with the ACS award winning researcher Prof. David O'Hagan.
