Curriculum Reviews

In their preliminary feedback, the CCI Academic Advisory Committee (see below) strongly recommended that we pay particular attention to reviewing and redefining our academic programs, especially at the undergraduate level. Based on this recommendation, we have requested and received a one-year delay of the University-level program reviews so that we may spend the year on curricular development. More information will be provided as plans are developed.

Sept. 20 – The CS faculty kicked off efforts to revise their Bachelors, Masters and Ph.D. degrees, with the intent of making them modern reflections of the discipline, useful, and exciting for students.

Academic Advisory Committee

The CCI Academic Advisory Committee met on campus on Sept. 25-27. The committee is expected to issue a report to the Provost in October. Because Provost Herbst will leave office soon, she included several UAlbany officers in the committee's initial debriefing. Preliminary comments were also provided to the chairs and to the faculty.
