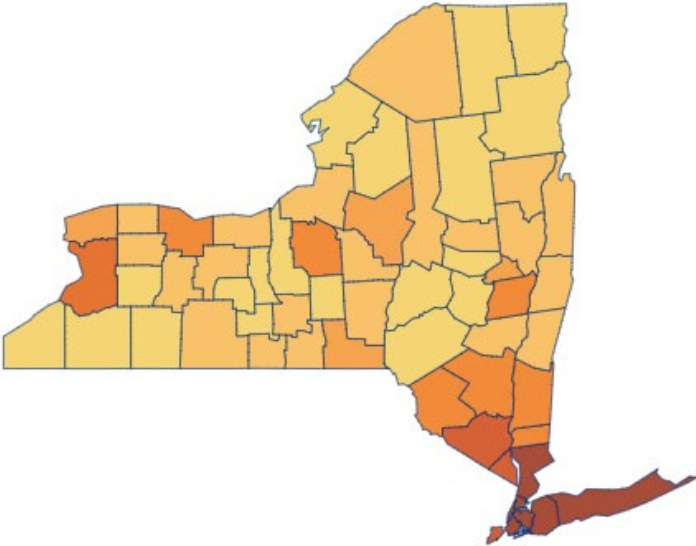

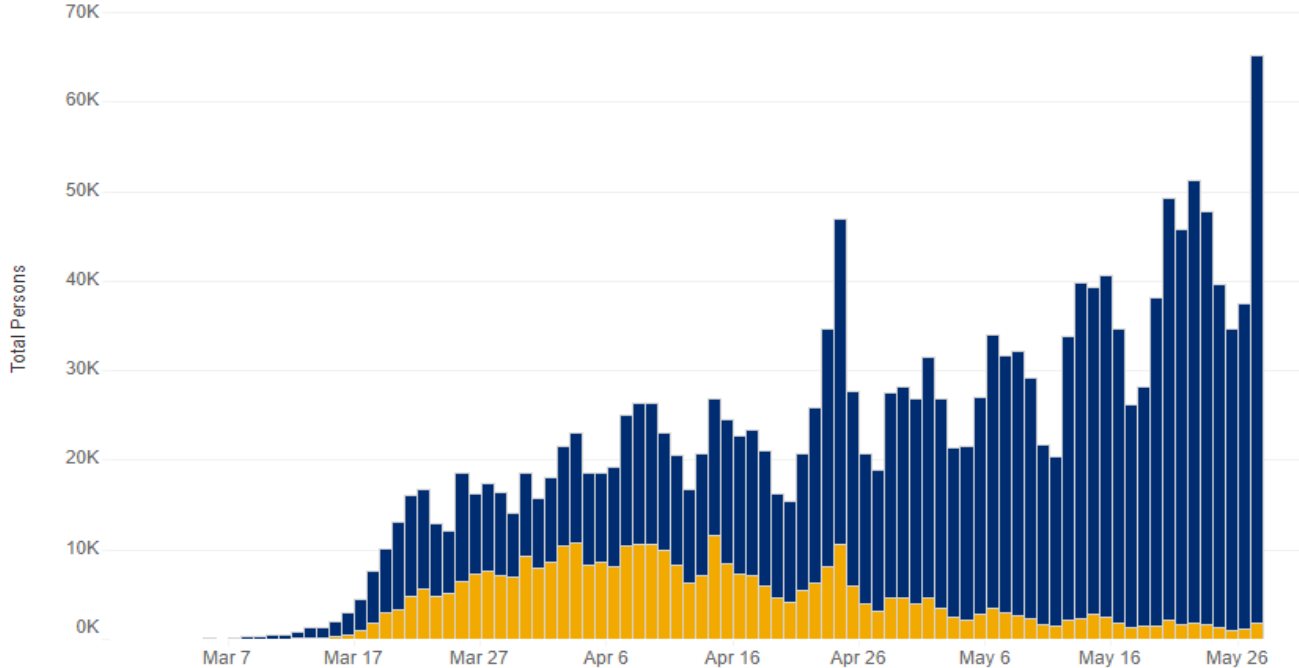
Daily Totals: Persons Tested and Persons Tested Positive

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Executive Leadership Actions to Address Racial Disparities in Maternal Health

- NYS COVID-19 Maternity Task Force
 - Multi-disciplinary group of experts brought together to address issues relating to pregnancy and maternity care during the COVID19 pandemic
 - Members developed a series of recommendations including increasing community and provider awareness of how COVID-19 is impacting pregnant women, especially those already impacted by racial/ethnic disparities
- Governor Cuomo's Task Force on Maternal Mortality & Disparate Racial Outcomes
 - Recommended the development of a comprehensive training and education program for hospitals on implicit racial bias
 - New York State is working on the development of this project and will begin recruiting birthing hospitals and centers to participate in Fall 2020


