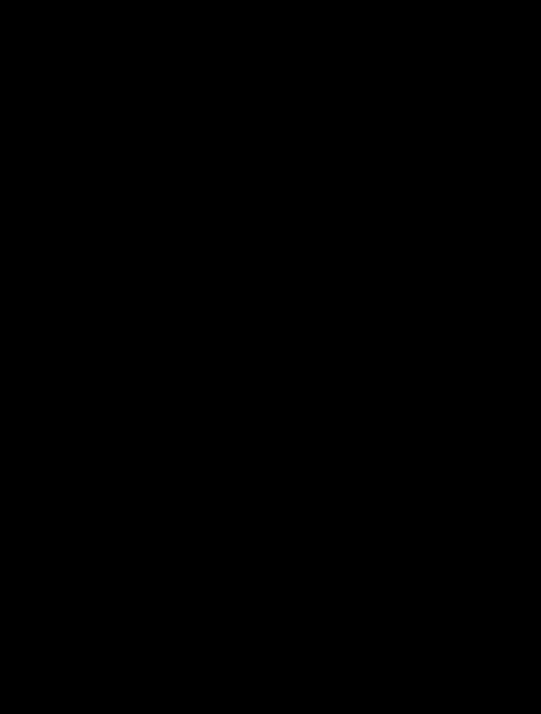

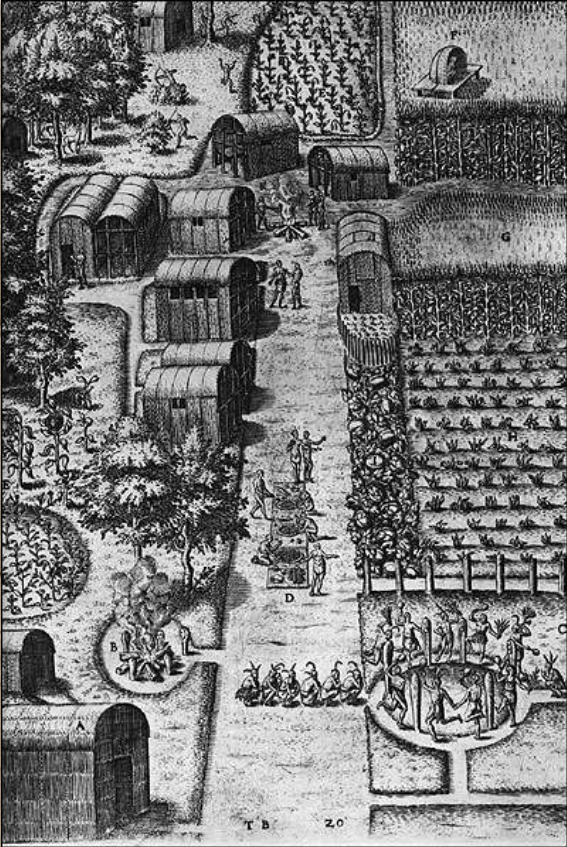

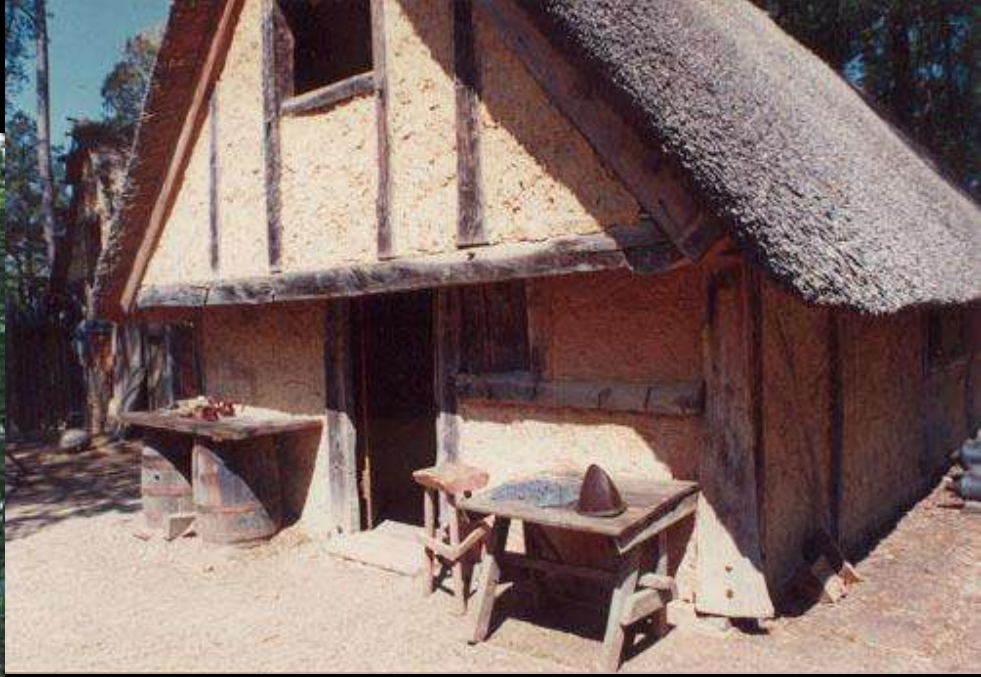
Distances and Directions to Carolina the South  
Given by William 1662











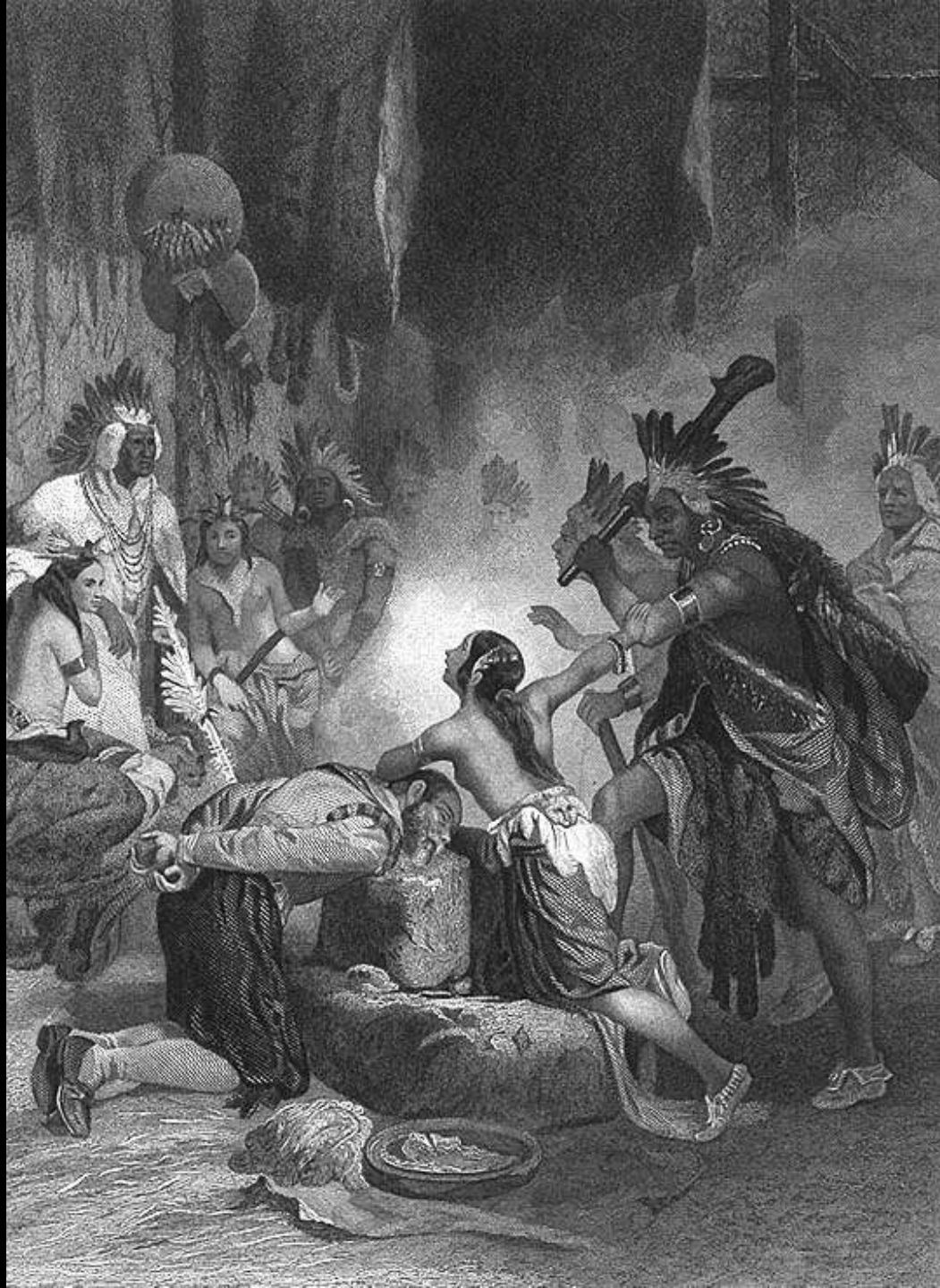

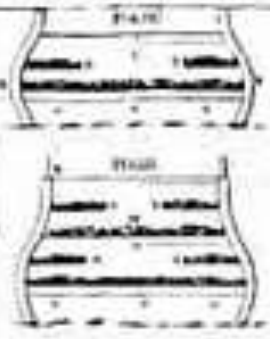
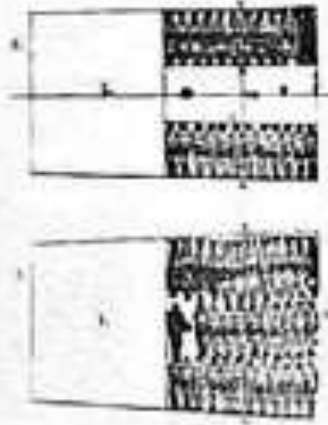
This Indenture Made the  
 day of April in the Year of our Lord One thou-  
 sand Seven hundred and ninety Seven, *Witnesseth*  
 that Levi Vanhooken and Jacob Ostrander Overseers of the  
 Poor of the Town of Shawangunk in the County of Ulster and  
 State of New York by and with the consent of James Kavin and  
 Johannes Bouvier Esquires, two of the Justices of the peace for  
 said County, have put placed and bound, and by these pre-  
 sents do put place and bind Benjamin Evans a Pauper  
 apprentice to Nicholas Hoffman to the same place and to his  
 Heirs, with him to serve and dwell from the day of the date of  
 these presents until the said apprentice shall arrive at the  
 age of twenty one Years fully to be complete and ended accord-  
 ing to the Act in that Case made and provided. He having  
 been of the age of four years, and ten months the day and  
 Year above written, during which said term the said Appren-  
 tice, his Master shall well and faithfully serve in all law-  
 ful business according to his Wit power and ability and  
 shall honestly and orderly in all things behave and demean  
 himself toward his said Master during said term; And the  
 said Nicholas Hoffman for himself his Heirs, Executors and  
 Administrators doth covenant to and with the Overseers of the  
 Poor of the Town aforesaid and their and every of their succe-  
 sors for the time being, that he the said Nicholas Hoff-  
 man the said Apprentice shall teach or cause to be taught  
 and instructed to read and write, and during said term he  
 provide and allow unto his said Apprentice competent and  
 sufficient Meat drink apparel washing and lodging, and  
 other things necessary and fit for such an Apprentice.  
 And also shall and will so provide for the said apprentice  
 that he do not



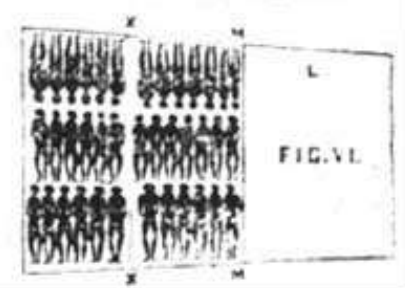
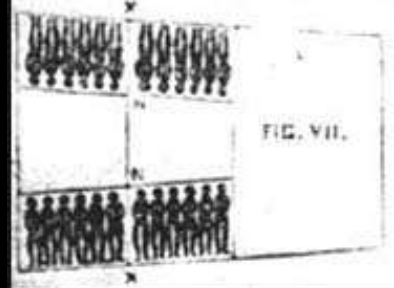
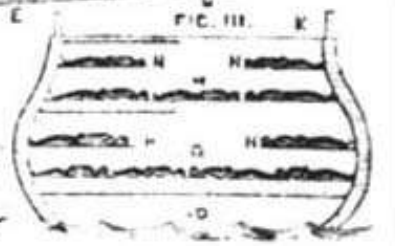
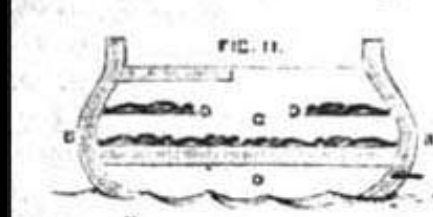
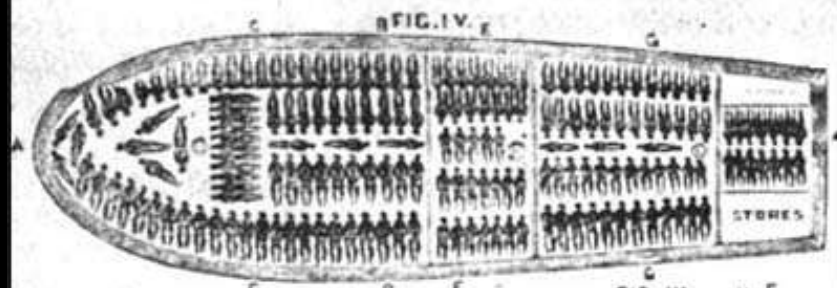
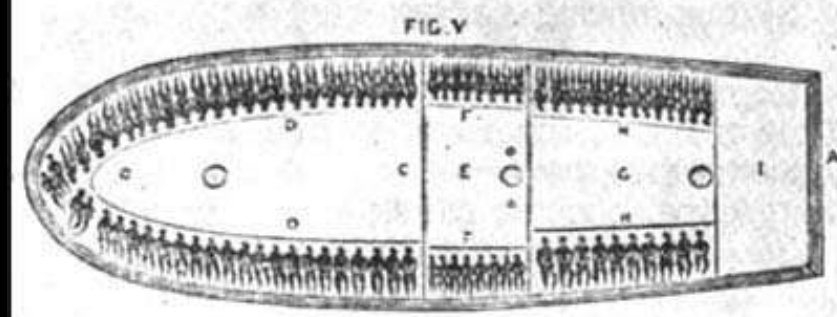
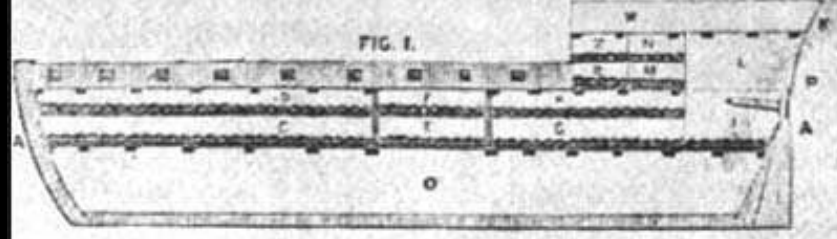
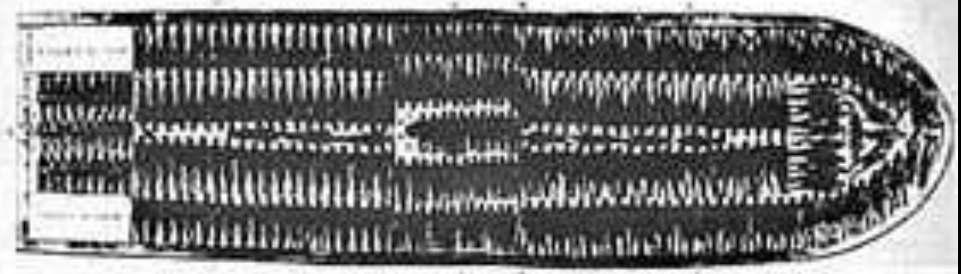
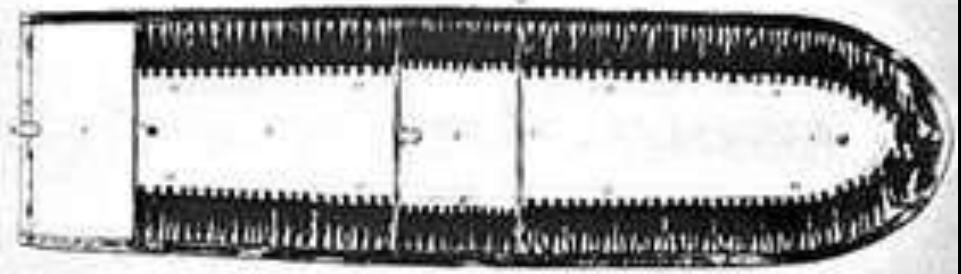
# PLAN AND SECTIONS OF A SLAVE SHIP.

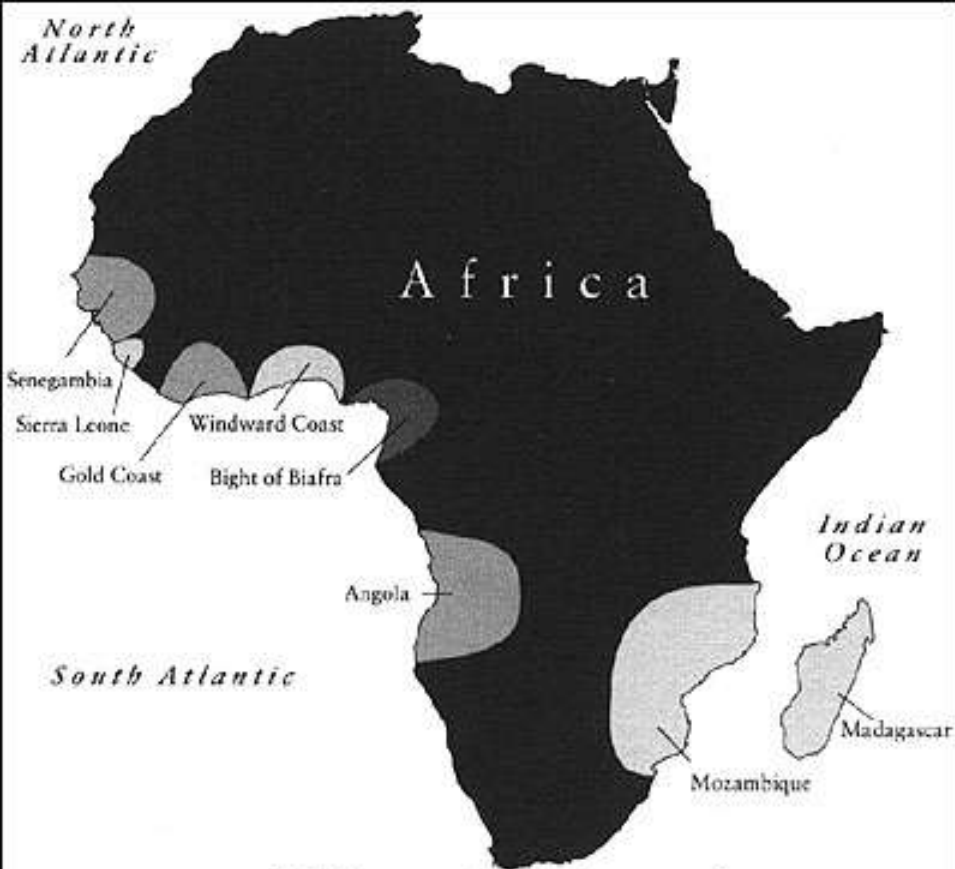

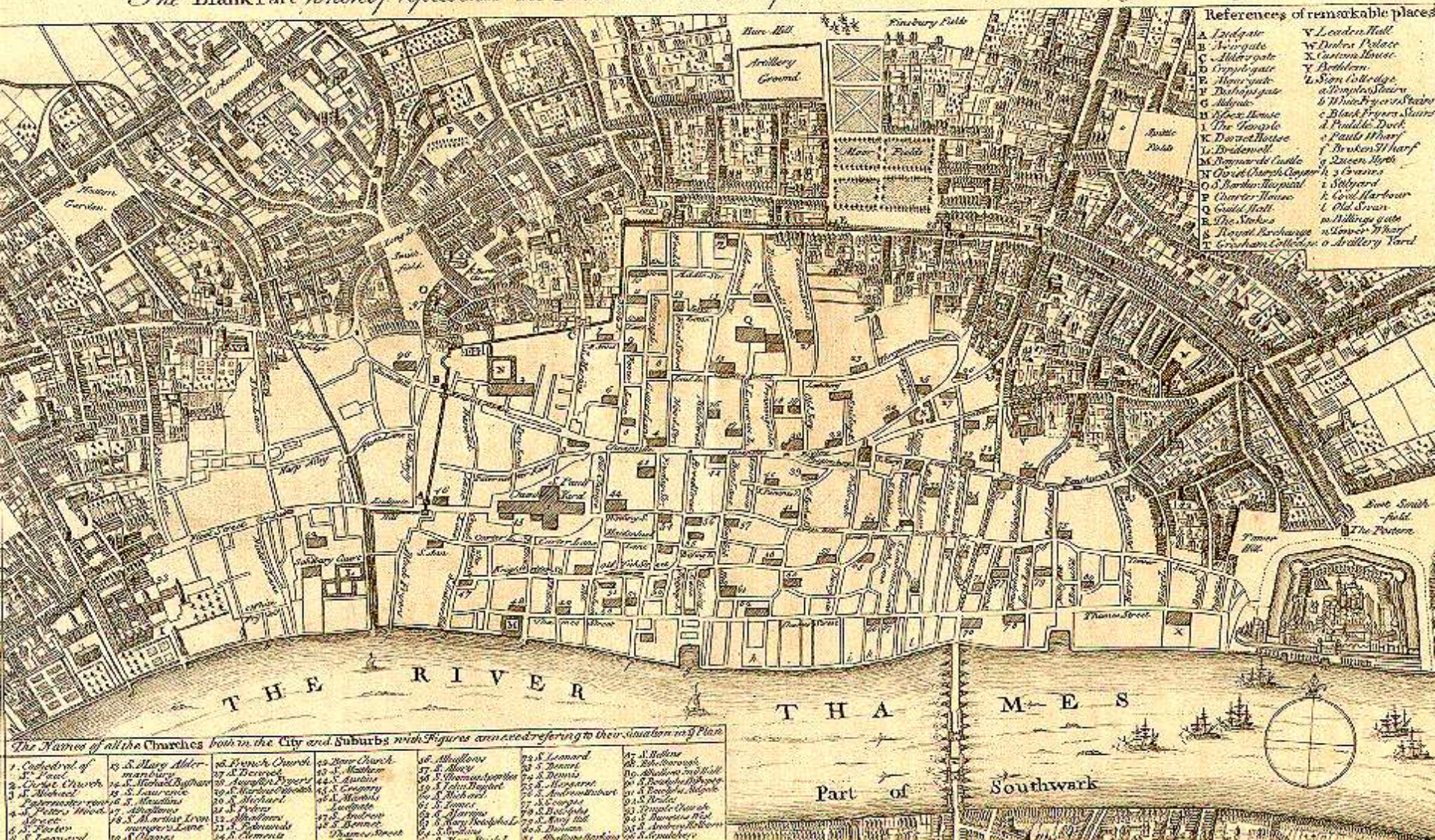

Ciuill body politick; for <sup>our</sup> better ordering, & preservation & fur-  
therance of y<sup>e</sup> ends aforesaid; and by vertue hereof, to enacte,  
constitute, and frame such just & equall Lawes, ordinances,  
Acts, constitutions, & offices, from time to time, as shall be thought  
most meete & conuenient for y<sup>e</sup> generall good of y<sup>e</sup> Colonie: vnto  
which we promise all due submission and obedienc. In witness  
whereof we haue hereunder subscribed our names at Cap-  
Codd y<sup>e</sup> 11. of Nouember, in y<sup>e</sup> year of y<sup>e</sup> raigne of our soueraigne  
Lord King James of England, France, & Ireland y<sup>e</sup> eighteenth

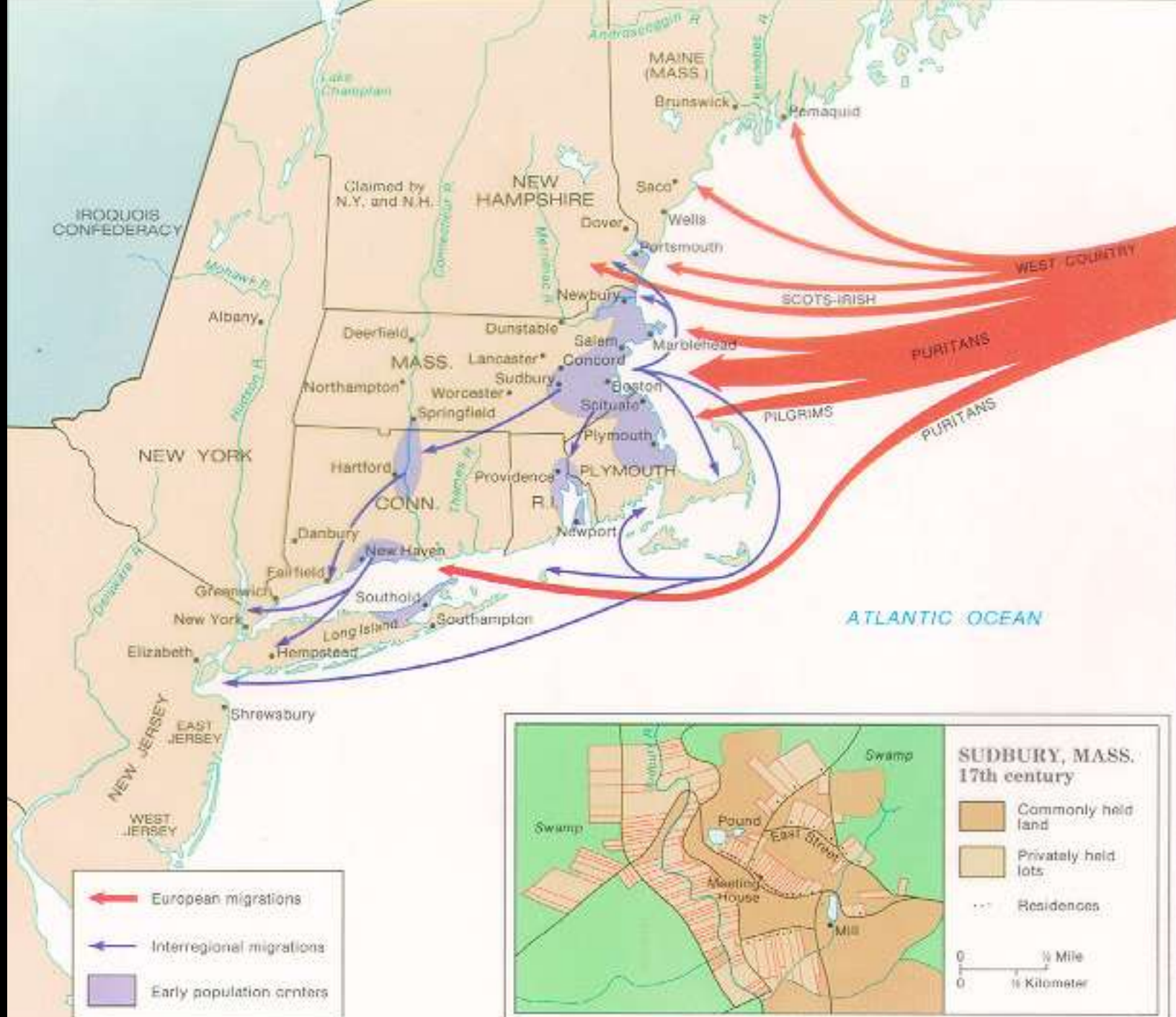

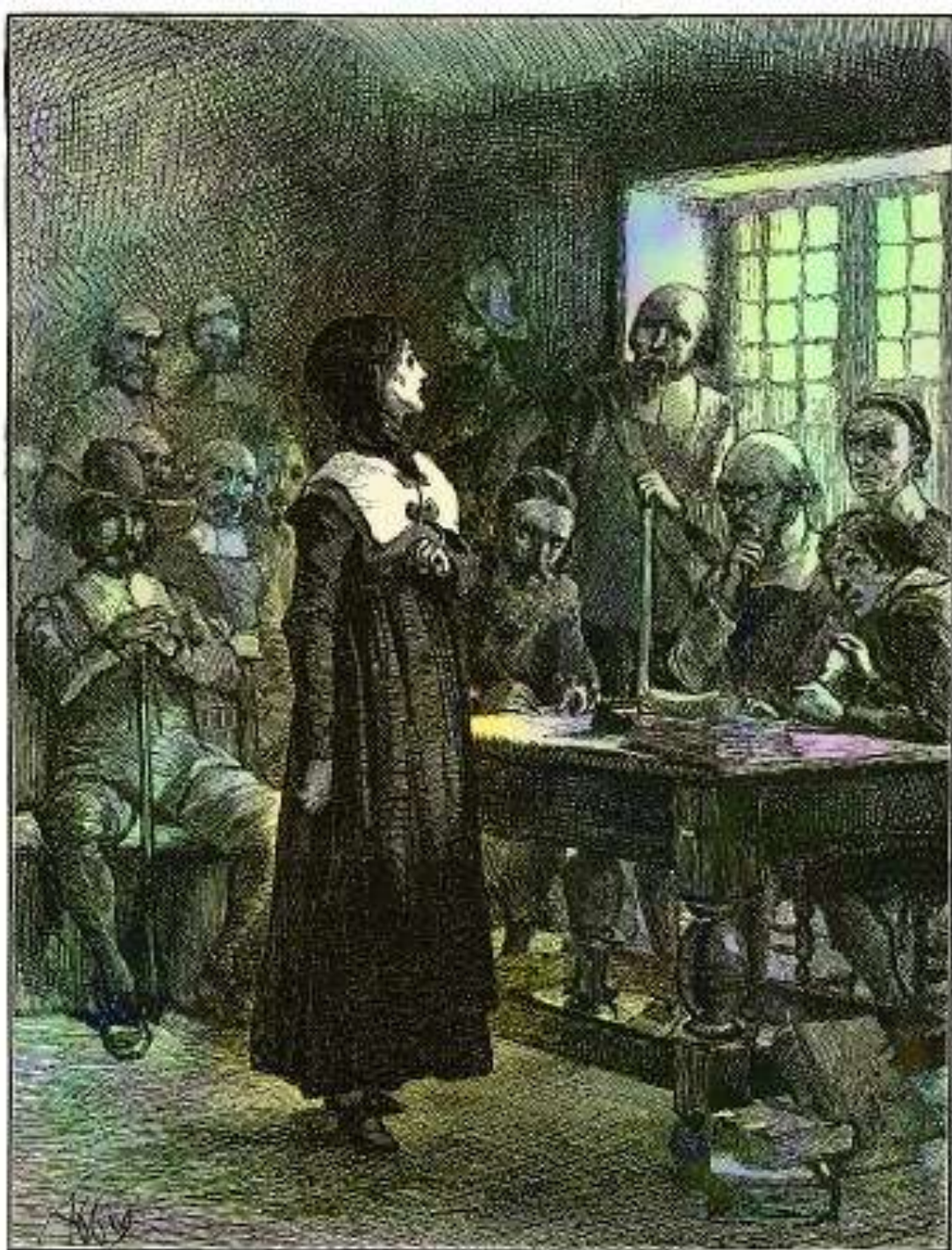

The Capitall Lawes of *New-England*, as they stand  
now in force in the Common-Wealth.

BY THE COVRT,

17

In the Years 1641. 1642.

Capitall Lawes, Eftablished within the Jurisdiction of *Massachusetts*.

1. **I**F any man after legall conviction, shall have or worship any o'her God, but the Lord God, he shall be put to death. *Deut. 13. 6, &c. and 17. 2. &c. Exodus 22. 20.*
2. **I**F any man or woman be a Witch, that is, hath or consulteth with a familiar spirit, they shall be put to death. *Exod. 22. 18. Lev. 20. 27. Deut. 18. 10, 11.*
3. **I**F any person shall blaspheme the Name of God the Father, Sonne, or Holy Ghost, with direct, expresse, presumptuous, or high-handed blasphemy, or shall curse God in the like manner, he shall be put to death. *Lev. 24. 15, 16.*
4. **I**F any person shall commit any wilfull murder, which is manslaughter, committed upon premeditate malice, hatred, or cruelty, not in a mans necessary and just defence, nor by meer casualtie, against his will; he shall be put to death. *Exod. 21. 12, 13, 14. Num. 35. 30, 31.*
5. **I**F any person slayeth another suddenly in his anger, or cruelty of passion, he shall be put to death. *Num. 35. 20, 21. Lev. 24. 17.*
6. **I**F any person shall slay another through guile, either by poysonings, or other such divilish practice; he shall be put to death. *Exod. 21. 14.*
7. **I**F a man or woman shall lye with any beast, or bruit creature, by carnall copulation, they shall surely be put to death; and the beast shall be slaine, and buried. *Lev. 20. 15, 16.*
8. **I**F a man lyeth with mankind, as he lyeth with a woman, both of them have committed abomination, they both shall surely be put to death. *Lev. 20. 13.*
9. **I**F any person committeth adultery with a married, or espoused wife, the Adulterer, and the Adulteresse, shall surely be put to death. *Lev. 20. 10. and 18. 20. Deut. 22. 23, 24.*
10. **I**F any man shall unlawfully have carnall copulation with any woman-child under ten yeares old, either with, or without her consent, he shall be put to death.
11. **I**F any man shall forcibly, and without consent, ravish any maid or woman that is lawfully married or contracted, he shall be put to death. *Deut. 22. 25. &c.*
12. **I**F any man shall ravish any maid or single woman (committing carnall copulation with her by force, against her will) that is above the age of ten yeares; he shall be either punished with death, or with some other grievous punishment, according to circumstances, at the discretion of the Judges: and this Law to continue till the Court take further order.
13. **I**F any man stealeth a man, or man-kinde, he shall surely be put to death. *Exod. 21. 16.*
14. **I**F any man rise up by false witnesse wittingly, and of purpose to take away any mans life, he shall be put to death. *Deut. 19. 16, 18, 19.*
15. **I**F any man shall conspire, or attempt any invasion, insurrection, or publick rebellion against our Common-wealth, or shall indeavour to surprize any Towne or Townes, Fort or Forts therein: or shall treacherously, or perfidiously attempt the alteration and subversion of our frame of pollity, or government fundamentally, he shall be put to death. *Num. 16. 2 Sam. 3. & 18. & 20.*

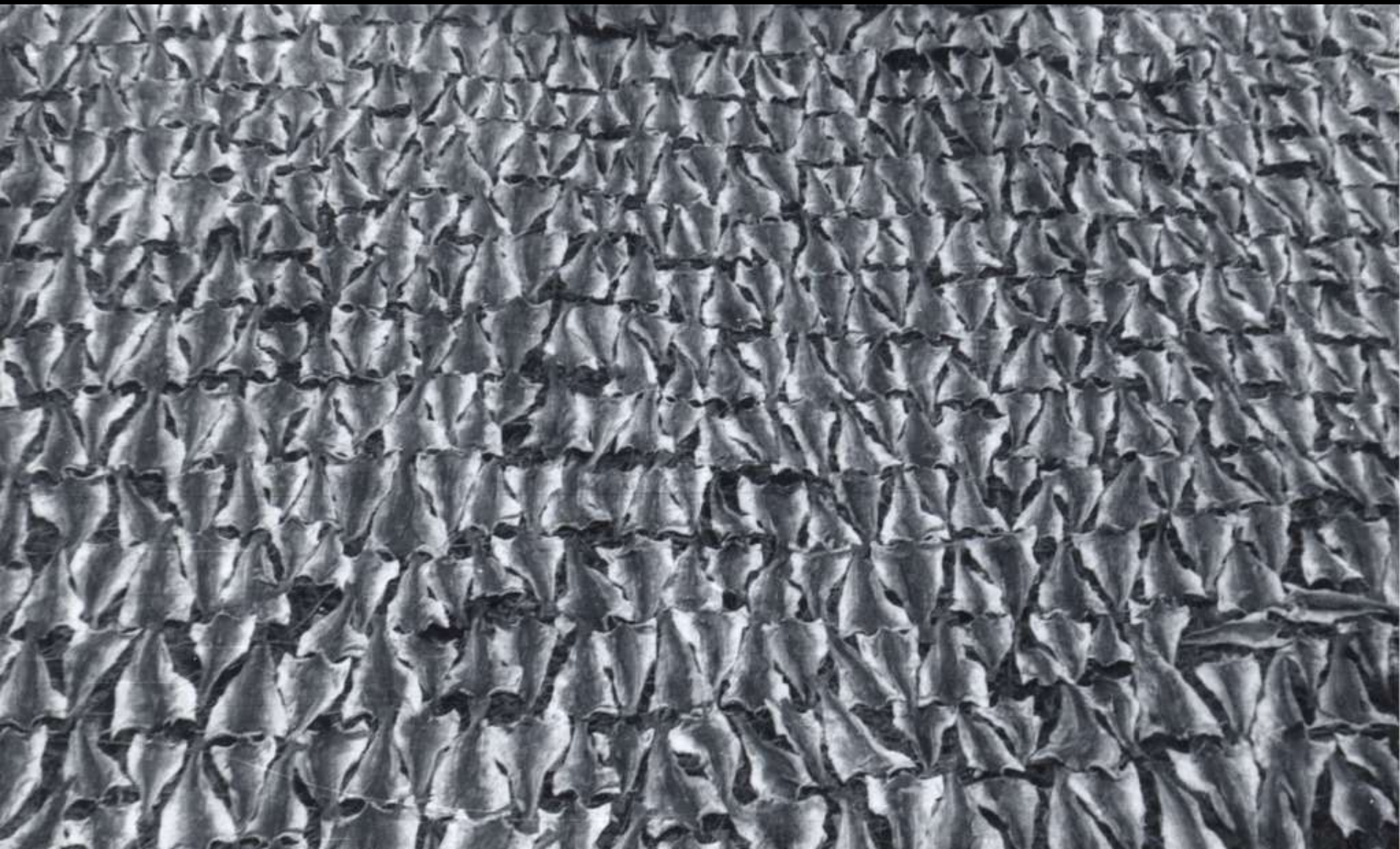

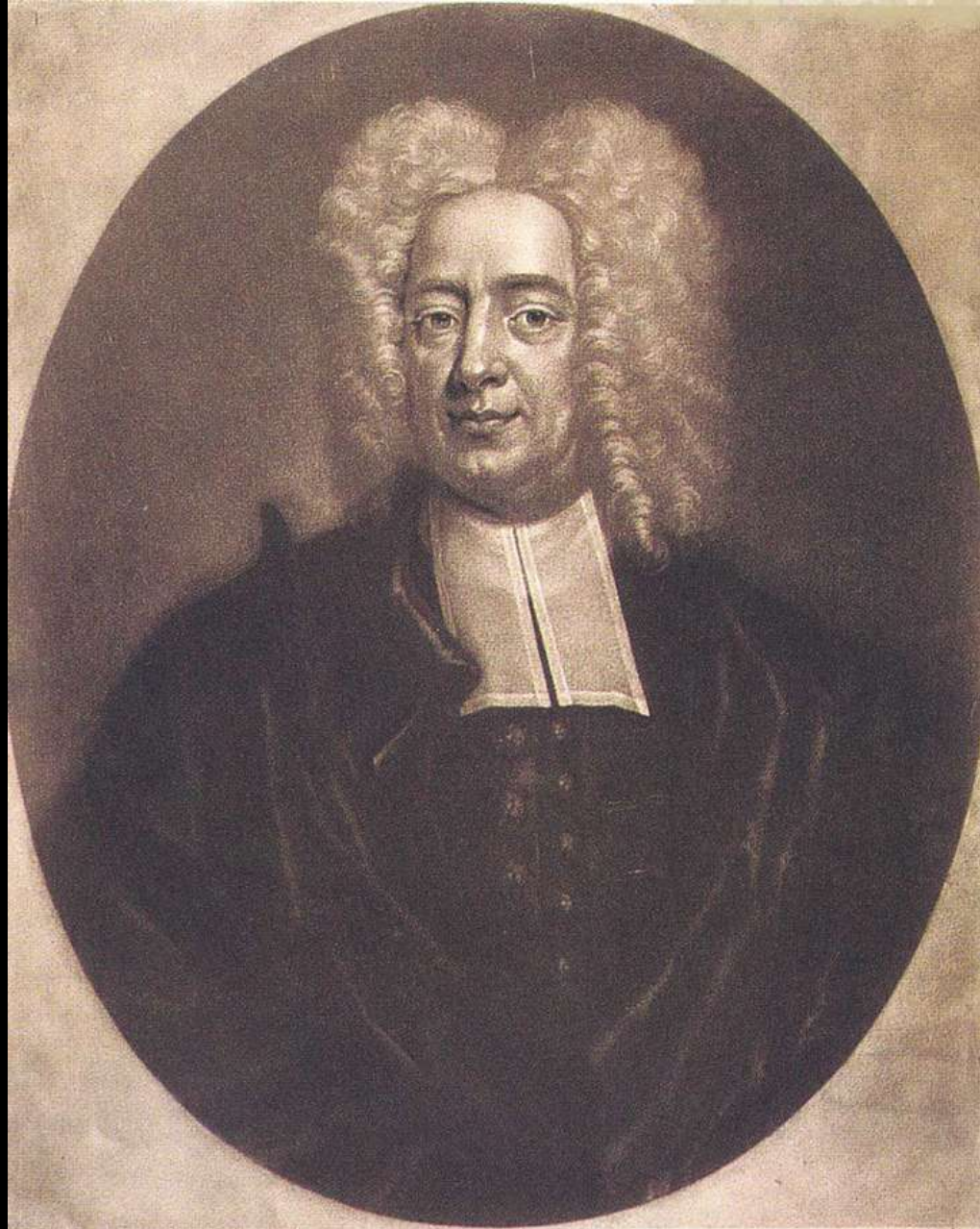

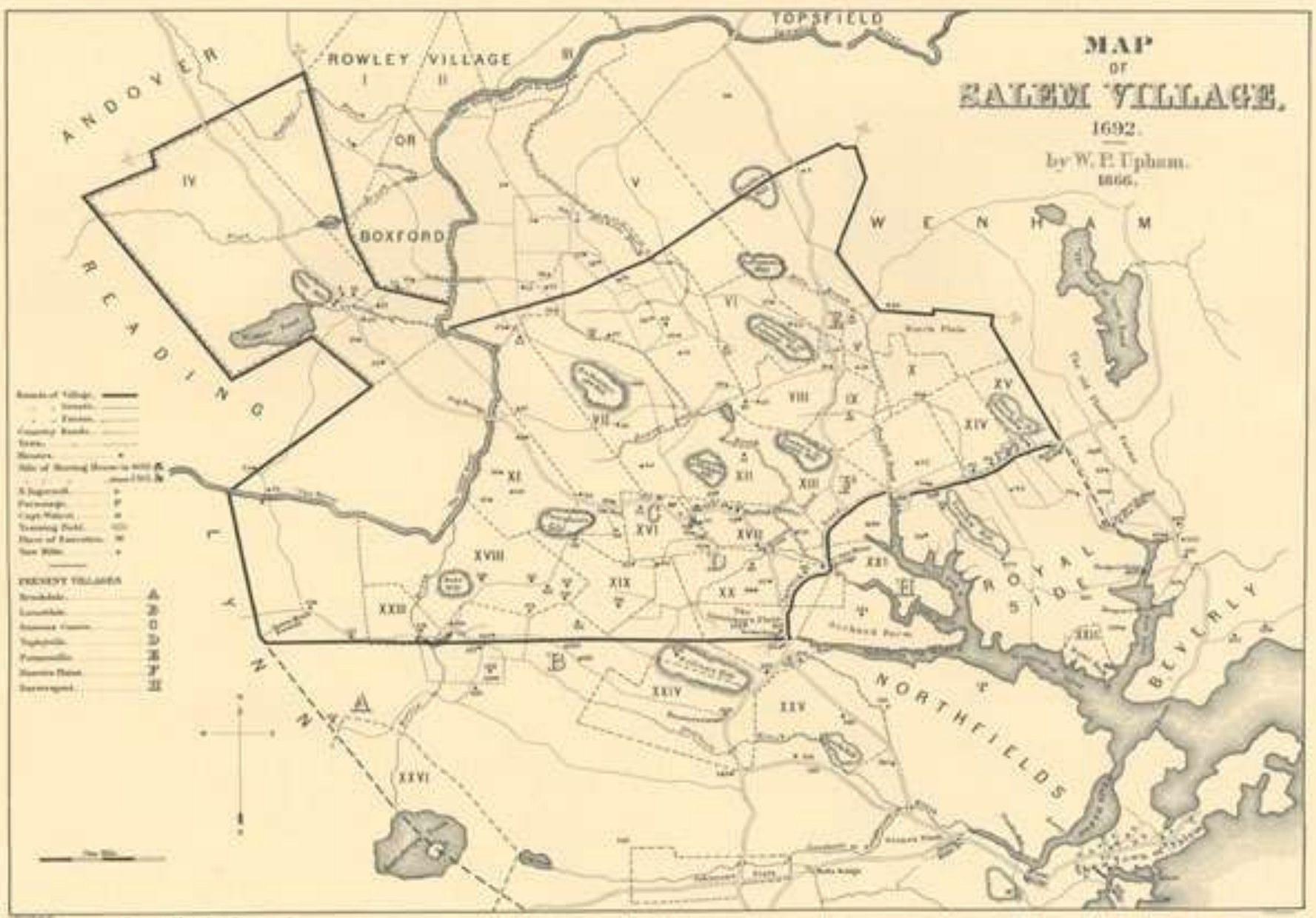






# MAP OF SALEM VILLAGE.
