<p>The University at Albany MRP Program uses direct assessment measures to evaluate student knowledge and performance in an annual assessment required by the Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences. These measures include: <i>acquiring knowledge of general planning history, principles, and practice; acquiring knowledge of general planning history, principles, and practice; develop knowledge in one of several alternative fields of specialization; developing effective research and writing skills, technical skills and proficiency in the most current planning support systems, including statistics, GIS, and other analytic and visualization tools; and gaining experience working in professional teams and with persons of different disciplinary backgrounds to better understand planning ethics, justice and equity, and the complexities of diverse populations.</i> For 2017-2018, all metrics were met or exceeded expectations. At the Upstate New York Chapter APA conference in Ithaca, NY, on October 4, 2018, the MRP Program received regional acclaim with the awarding of an APA Award Certificate for the <i>Menands 2017-2018 MRP Studio</i> classes.</p>
