OPT Information for Spring Graduates

You can join ISSS for an <u>in-person OPT workshop</u> on **Monday, February 26** from **3-4:30pm** in **Physics 123.** See you there!

Important OPT Dates for Spring Graduates to Know:

- I-20 Program End Date for students graduating this Spring: May 8, 2024
 - Bachelor's/Master's students graduating this Spring will all have a program end date of May 8, 2024
 - PhD students may use defense date, thesis submission date, or last date of final term as the program end date for post-completion OPT purposes. The date you choose will change your application timetable, see OPT workshop for details.
- Filing Opens February 9 for students with a May 8, 2024 program end date
- Filing Closes July 6 for students with a May 8, 2024 program end date
- Students with a May 8, 2024 program end date may submit a **request for an OPT start date** for any date in this range: **May 9, 2024 through July 6, 2024**.
- Upcoming USCIS fee increases: USCIS is increasing it's filing fee for the I-765 from \$410 to \$470 effective April 1, 2024 (for online filing- filing by mail will cost more). File before then to save cost on the fees. The I-907 premium processing fee for I-765 applications increases on February 26 from \$1500 to \$1685.

Students who are graduating and planning to apply for Post-Completion OPT Work Authorization should complete the following steps to apply:

- 1. Watch the required OPT workshop -- or attend the in-person workshop on February 26.
- 2. Review all instructions on the **OPT Request EForm website**, including the **Supplemental Forms** and **Instructions**
- 3. Submit the EForm to ISSS to request a new I-20 recommending you for post-completion OPT
- File with DHS-USCIS within 30 days of receiving the new I-20 from ISSS recommending you for post-completion OPT

Sprintax Tax Filing Information for 2024



ISSS has purchased Sprintax tax software to help international students and scholars to file their 2023 federal tax return. There is no personal exemption for 2023. All non-residents must file a tax return if income was earned in 2023.

If you were employed in 2023, to obtain a Sprintax tax code, please complete the google form at this link: https://forms.gle/fLCS214CqwR8wu1u6. If you were not_employed, please go to: https://www.irs.gov/pub/irs-pdf/f8843.pdf to obtain form 8843. For questions, please contact ISSS.

It is important to be aware that, if you were a nonresident present in the US during 2023, you're legally required to file a tax return if you received US income during 2023 by the 15 April 2024 deadline. And even if you didn't work or receive income in the US, you're still obliged to file a Form 8843 with the IRS.

The US 2023 tax season will not start until January 2024, and we will be sharing information regarding how you can use the Sprintax software when the tax season begins.

Applying to Graduate School Webinar (2/19)




Monday, February 19 from 6:30-7:30pm online. Register for Zoom link.
