Dr. Nina Aledort is the Deputy Commissioner of the Division of Youth Development and Partnerships for Success with the New York State Office of Children and Family Services.

She has been a practitioner and policy maker for over 25 years with a focus on improving outcomes for youth with significant vulnerabilities, using positive youth development, gender-responsive frameworks and harm reduction. Her areas of expertise include LGBTO, runaway and homeless, trafficked, and court-involved



youth. Dr. Aledort focuses on key policy challenges at the intersection of child welfare, juvenile justice, child sex trafficking, runaway and homeless youth, and on disparate impacts.

She is a founding co-chair of the NYS Partnership for Youth Justice and an author of several peer-reviewed articles. Dr. Aledort has presented nationally and internationally.

She has an MSW from Hunter College School of Social Work, City University of New York and a PhD in Social Welfare from the Graduate Center of the City University of New York.
