Stephen Goldmeier is a public defender and systems analyst. He is currently a consultant with Just-Tech LLC, working on technology projects and case-management solutions for the civil legal services community. He is also one of the leaders and co-conveners of the Indigent Defense Research Association. Stephen received his bachelor's degree in secondary education, with minors in chemistry and physics, from Otterbein University, and graduated from DePaul University's College of Law with a certificate in intellectual property law.



He began his career as an Assistant Public Defender in the appeals and postconviction section of the Office of the Ohio Public Defender, where he litigated cases in every phase of a criminal proceeding, including successfully arguing two cases in the Ohio Supreme Court. He then worked in the policy and outreach department of that office, co-leading the design and deployment of a unified state-wide data-collection and case-management system. Then, he was the Organizational Systems Analyst at the Bronx Defenders, where he was project lead for a number of process-improvement and technology-deployment projects.

Stephen has taught nationally about a wide variety of subjects, including legal writing, storytelling, systems design, data collection, and forensic science.
