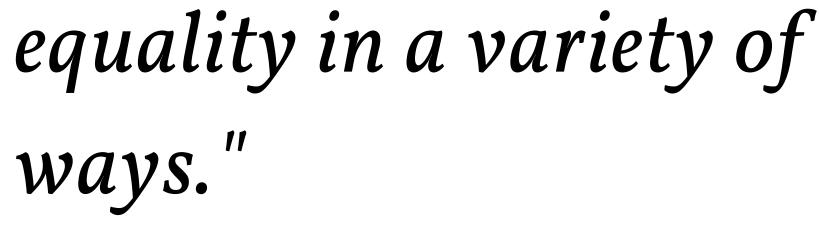

# **non-binary** adjective

"An adjective describing a person who does not identify exclusively as a man or a woman. Nonbinary people may identify as being both a man and a woman, somewhere in between, or as falling completely outside these categories. While many also identify as transgender, not all non-binary people do."

# **Gueer** adjective \'kwir \

"[A]n umbrella term to describe individuals who don't identify as straight and/or cisgender [someone whose gender does not align with the sex they were assigned at birth]." While the noun form is often considered a derogatory slur, "queer" as a descriptor has been reclaimed by many as a word of empowerment and is widely acceptable.

### Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity/Expression (S.O.G.I.E.)

Everyone has a sexual orientation, gender identity, and gender expression, which is summarized by the term SOGIE. This term applies to everyone, including those who identify as cisgender or

heterosexual. SOGIE-minority identities are those that are typically included in LGBTQ+ or queer definitions.

"An umbrella term for people whose gender identity and/or expression is different from cultural expectations based on the sex they were assigned at birth. Being transgender does not imply any specific sexual orientation. Therefore, transgender people may identify as straight, gay, lesbian, bisexual, etc."

# transitioning

"The social, legal, and/or medical process a trans\* person may go through to make their gender identity fit their gender expression, presentation, or sex. This word means many different things to different people, and a person doesn't have to experience all or

any of these common transitioning elements to identify as their true gender."
