Courses Taught (*courses taught and designed marked by asterisk)

Introduction to 3D Art

Beginning sculpture course for art and non-art majors, which overviews basic in instruction in materials, tools, and process used in making creative objects

Advanced Sculpture

Each student was given the requirement of creating ten new sculptures over the course of the semester that had thematic consistency so that they formed a new body of work

Creative Strategies

Introductory course for incoming art students that overviews various methods and approaches for how to tactically and thoughtfully start and complete their own art projects

*Studio Experiments in Visual Thinking

Idea-based course in which the assignments are lead by the interests of the students, and their outcomes are not predetermined by material or media, but rather by their logic in relation to the initial concept

*Interactive Design Environments

Course in which the students explore art that is created for non-art contexts through both research and production

*Electronic Drawing/Media Arts Lab

Course that offers art and design students the opportunity to incorporate digital and other technologies into their art practice while overviewing the history of 20th century technology

Alternative Media

Upper division class devoted to teaching students how to creatively use digital photography and video, editing and printing in assigned and self-directed projects

*Working Collaboratively

Studio course which gives art and design students the opportunity to work on projects with other students, peers, family members and strangers in an involved and integral manner

*Senior Studio

Final class for graduating senior art majors to take to help them prepare their work for the thesis exhibition, along with giving them professional development instruction

Graduate Seminar in Combined Media

Graduate level class that introduces social practice—a socially conscious, participatory art movement—to students through readings, field trips, and the creation of artworks that illustrate the themes discussed.

Nadadada (7)

Course (in its seventh year) based around the students making new artwork for and planning a well-publicized, off campus exhibition

*Documentary Art

History and studio class which overviews important examples of documentary filmmaking,

coupled with two minor and one major documentary video assignments

*Conceptual Art

History and studio class which overviews the basic premises of the Conceptual Art movement accompanied by artmaking assignments related to the subject matter

*Vandalism, Iconoclasm, and Political Activism

Critical/historical seminar that overviews the political implications of vandalism and iconoclasm throughout the 20th century
