The graphs and statistical analysis in our report summarize responses from 582 survey respondents and, where feasible, draw comparisons to the nation and Alexandria's local population. The composite profile that emerges shows near universal full-time employment, full- and/or part-time employment of multiple household members, yet a high degree of rent stress and economic vulnerability with high housing burden and housing adjustments.

Parnell, Alan M. and Glenn Deane. 2019. Prepared for the Southern Center for Human Rights. *Racial Differences in Trial Assignment to Superior Court for Juveniles in Georgia, 2001-2017*. This report assesses whether black juveniles were more likely to be tried in Superior Court rather than Juvenile Court relative to white juveniles when charged with four rape/sexual assault crimes (rape, aggravated sexual battery, aggravated sodomy and aggravated child molestation) and three serious violent crimes (murder, manslaughter and armed robbery) that are not sexual assault for the period 2001 through 2017. We found: the relative risk (RR) that a black juvenile was tried in Superior Court was 1.30 times higher than for a white juvenile; Superior Court trial for rape/ sexual assault was much more likely for black youth relative to white youth; regardless of race, over 60% of juveniles charged with a serious violent crime were tried in Superior Court, but black juveniles were almost 12 times more likely than white juveniles to be charged with a serious violent crime; and Black juveniles were more likely to be charged with high counts of a criminal charge, contributing to their greater likelihood of being tried in Superior Court.
