TEACHING & MENTORSHIP

COURSES TAUGHT at ALBANY:

- AHIS 158: Past of the Present. This survey course explores social change, warfare, nationalism, and globalization during the 'long' 20th century.
- AHST 202: Not Even Past. This class teaches research skills by asking whether it is too soon for historians to study the 'war on terror.'
- AHIS 290: Cold War as History. This class introduces research skills by examining several turning points in the Cold War.
- AHIS 290: Black Lives Matter as History. This course teaches research skills by exploring antiracist protest movements after World War II.
- AHIS 290: War on Terror as History. A course about U.S. foreign relations in the build-up and aftermath of the September 11 terrorist attacks.
- AHIS 290: A History of *Your* America. This class, co-taught with Carl Bon Tempo and Kori Graves, will explore U.S. and the world history since 1975.
- AHIS 311: U.S. Foreign Relations to 1919. This course teaches writing skills and explains the expansion of American power during the 19th century.
- AHIS 312: U.S. Foreign Relations since 1919. This course teaches writing skills and looks at American efforts to alter world order during the 20th century.
- AHIS 395: Historian's Craft. This methods course teaches students how to think historically, collect evidence, and choreograph arguments.
- AHIS 489z: Capstone Seminar. This capstone seminar guides undergraduate students through the senior thesis experience.
- AHIS 495-496: Honors Capstone Seminar. This two-semester capstone seminar guides honors students through their senior thesis experience.

AHIS 497: Independent Study in History. This 1:1 course is used to teach various directed readings and oversee undergraduate research projects.

AHIS 499: Special Project in History. This course facilitates student internships and experiential learning projects.

AHIS 603/633: Readings in United States & the World History. This graduate seminar introduces students to literature about U.S. foreign relations from 1860 to the present.

AHIS 610: Writing in United States & the World History. This graduate research seminar guides students as they complete an article-length paper about U.S./world history.
