Robert D. McEvoy, ICMA, CM

Rockefeller College of Public Affairs & Policy

Professor McEvoy has instructed, advised, and helped place Rockefeller College students in local government management positions since 1980. He has also taught at the Babes-Bolyai University in Cluj, Romania, where he was a distinguished professor, and at the Higher School of Economics in Moscow. He began his professional education in public administration at New York University, where he received the MPA degree in 1973 and was admitted to the doctoral program following the doctoral qualifying examination. He was completing his course requirements and assembling his committee when he was recruited to become the County Manager of Schenectady County, where he served for 22 years.

Professor McEvoy's teaching and research has focused on local government management, urban policy analysis, local government systems and services throughout the world, including professional management, forms of government, and performance measurement/management. He received the Rockefeller College Distinguished Service Award in 2004 and the 2006-2007 SUNY President's Award for Excellence in Teaching by part-time faculty. He has served on the National Civic League's Model City and County Charter Committees and the Government Accounting Standards Advisory Council, where he was a member of the GASB SEA (performance reporting) Task Force. He has consulted with and addressed members of governments from Europe, Asia, Africa, and South America, and most recently members of the Parliaments of Kenya, Uganda, Ghana and Malawi.

Professor McEvoy is a credentialed manager and was the President and Executive Director of the New York State City County Management Association. He was also a city and village manager and a vice president of the International City County Management Association, where he was awarded ICMA's Distinguished Service Award in 2004. He has been the President of the Empire State Capitol Area Chapter of the American Society for Public Administration. He was the recipient of ASPA's Frank C. Moore Award in 1993 for "distinguished contributions to local government service". He currently serves on the ICMA Government Affairs and Policy Committee, which formulates and prepares national positions for the National Association of Counties, National League of Cities and other members of the "Big Seven" national advocacy group. He is also a member of the ICMA Credentialing Advisory Board which reviews applications and continuing education plans for professional credentialing. He is a Fellow of the New York State Academy

Professor McEvoy is the managing editor and editorial page author of the Journal of County Administration, a national publication. He has been a member of the International Advisory Board of the Transylvanian Review of Administrative Services.
