Note: These data were compiled by the Federal Bureau of Investigation through the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program. On a monthly basis, law enforcement agencies report the number of offenses that become known to them in the following crime categories: murder and nonnegligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson. Arrest statistics are compiled as part of this monthly data collection effort. Participating law enforcement agencies are instructed to count one arrest each time a person is taken into custody, notified, or cited for criminal infractions other than traffic violations. Annual arrest figures do not measure the number of individuals taken into custody because one person may be arrested several times during the year for the same type of offense or for different offenses. A juvenile is counted as a person arrested when he/she commits an act that would be a criminal offense if committed by an adult.

This table presents data from all law enforcement agencies submitting complete reports for 12 months in 2011 (Source, Table 69, Data Declaration). Population figures are estimates calculated from U.S. Census Bureau data. Direct comparisons of arrest totals listed in this table should not be made with prior years because law enforcement agency participation may vary (Source, Table 69, Data Declaration). No 2011 arrest data were received from Hawaii. For definitions of offenses, see [Appendix 3](#).

^aIncludes arrests for all 28 UCR offenses; does not include traffic arrests. For a list of included offenses, see [table 4.1.2011](#).

^bLimited arrest data were available for Alabama.

^cFor 2011, no arrest data were received from the District of Columbia Metropolitan Police Department. The two agencies for which 12 months of data were received, the Metro Transit Police and the National Zoological Park, have no attributable population.

^dLimited arrest data were received from the Illinois State UCR program. Arrest counts in this table include Chicago and Rockford only; forcible rape figures include data provided by Rockford only.

^eExcept for the cities of Minneapolis and St. Paul, forcible rape figures furnished by the State-level Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) program administered by the Minnesota Department of Public Safety were not in accordance with national UCR guidelines. Therefore, State forcible rape counts include arrests reported by Minneapolis and St. Paul only.
