Note: See Note, [table 5.44.2004](#). Additional penalties are penalties imposed by the court in addition to the primary penalty of jail, prison, or probation. Examples of penalties in the category "other" are community control, house arrest, work release, drug testing, and loss of driver's license. Where the data indicated affirmatively that a particular additional penalty was imposed, the case was coded accordingly. Where the data did not indicate affirmatively or negatively, the case was treated as not having an additional penalty. These procedures provide a conservative estimate of the prevalence of additional penalties. Persons receiving more than one type of additional penalty appear under more than one penalty heading. <sup>a</sup>Includes any type of counseling, rehabilitation, treatment, or mental hospital confinement.

<sup>b</sup>Includes offenses such as negligent manslaughter and kidnaping.
