



Dr. Donald Warne comes from a long line of traditional Lakota healers. Dr. Warne holds an MD from Stanford University and a Master of Public Health from Harvard University. He is also a Diplomate of both the American Board of Family Practice and the American Board of Medical Acupuncture.

Since 1998, Dr. Warne has worked as a family physician in the American Indian community. As a Staff Clinician with the National Institutes of Health in Phoenix from 2000 to 2003, he conducted diabetes research and developed [diabetes education](#) and prevention programs for Native American tribes.

Dr. Warne is currently associate professor and the director of the Master of Public Health program at North Dakota State University.

Recognized internationally as one of the most popular speakers on Native American health issues, Dr. Warne strongly believes that the health of the community determines the health of the individual. With that belief in mind, he started AIHMP to provide a comprehensive approach to improving healthcare in Indian Country.
