### -SPECIAL NOTE TO PART TIME FACULTY-

The raise in the base salary to \$2,800 this past fall benefited 81 part -time faculty across the campus. But its subsequent impact is that that of salary compression. Long term part-time faculty may be discovering that they are now making only slightly more than their newer colleagues. Discretionary Salary Increase (DSI) can be used to address salary compression. However, in order to be eligible for a DSI you must complete a Faculty Activity Report and submit it to your department chair or program head by June 1, 2007. The form is available on the University website (Academics page/lower right hand corner). Awards are made in the fall semester. 
