- Please send a request to Ravi giving your preferences for the dates. Please give at least two preferences. (Dates will be allocated on a first-come first-served basis.)

Information Regarding Presentations (continued)

- A list of papers for presentation (along with links to the pdf versions of the papers) is available through the List of Papers for Presentations link.
- If you want to present a paper which is not in the list, please check with Ravi first.
- Please let Ravi know which paper you want to present no later than Nov. 17, 2015.
- Papers will be assigned on a first-come first-served basis.
 (If you don't choose a paper by the above deadline, Ravi will choose one for you!)

Information Regarding Presentations (continued)

- Each student must also submit the following by Dec. 13, 2015.
 - A one page summary (about 400 words) of the paper presented by the student.
 - A half page summary (about 200 words) of one paper presented by another student.

Note: These summaries should be in the student's own words; they should **not** be taken verbatim from the abstract or other parts of papers.

- Each student must limit his/her presentation to 20 minutes and allow time for discussion.
- Students should remember that the presentation is for the whole class, not just the instructor.

Information Regarding Presentations (continued)

- Each student must email a pdf version of their slides to Ravi by 8 AM on the day of presentation.
- A suggested organization for the presentation is as follows.
 - Introduction and motivation: the research questions/issues addressed in the paper and why they are important.
 - A summary of prior work.
 - A brief description of the methods used and the main results of the paper.
 - Conclusions and directions for future research.
